Preface

The *Statistical Handbook* is designed as a reference document with basic enrollment, persistence and graduation, faculty, staff, degree, semester credit hour and financial information for the nine academic and six health-related institutions and The University of Texas System as a whole. Where available, data are reported for the most recent five years so that trends can be identified.

Data reported by the U. T. System institutions to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board have been used extensively in this publication. However, these data may vary somewhat from information presented and used internally by individual institutions due to differences in management information systems, data definitions, and intended application.

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General Analysis – Enrollment

In 1999 the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) published the first *Closing the Gaps (CTG)* report and challenged colleges and universities in the state of Texas to increase the number of students participating in higher education. Fall 2005 provides an important benchmark for evaluating our progress in meeting the *Closing the Gaps* participation targets.

Enrollment Trends

In fall 2005, total enrollment at U. T. System institutions was 185,816 students, an increase of 33,619 students (22.1%) from fall 2000. Overall, U. T. System universities achieved 98% of their *Closing the Gaps* enrollment targets.

- Enrollment at academic institutions was 174,846, an increase of 31,808 students (22.2%) since fall 2000. U. T. System academic institutions achieved 97.5% of their *Closing the Gaps* enrollment targets and grew faster than the statewide average increase of 17%.
- Enrollment at health institutions was 10,970, an increase of 1,811 students (19.8%) since fall 2000. U. T. System health institutions achieved 108% of their *Closing the Gaps* enrollment targets.

From fall 2000 to fall 2005, undergraduate enrollment at all U. T. System institutions grew by 21.8%, graduate enrollment grew by 26.1% and professional enrollment grew by 6.3%. At the academic institutions, the proportion of undergraduates remains the same as in fall 2000, 80.7%. At the health institutions, there are more graduate students in fall 2005 than professional students, 45.1% and 37.5% respectively.

Overall, gender distributions at U. T. System remained fairly steady over the past five years, with male enrollment around 46% and female enrollment around 54%. There has been, however, a steady increase in the percentage of women attending the health institutions, from 58% in fall 2000 to 61% in fall 2005.

Ethnic distributions at the institutions continue to change as the population of Texas becomes more diverse.

- System-wide, the percentage of white students decreased from 47.1% in fall 2000 to 40.8% in fall 2005.
- At the academic institutions, the percentage of African American and Asian American students increased slightly, and the Hispanic population increased from 33.3% to 37.8%.
- At the health institutions, the International population increased from 6% to 11.3%.

U. T. System institutions also serve diverse regions throughout Texas.

- The highest enrollments at academic institutions are from the regions that include the major population centers in the state - South Texas (37.8%), the Metroplex (22.9%), Upper Rio Grande (11.4%) and the Gulf Coast (11.3%).

- The highest percentage of students at the health institutions come from the Gulf Coast (48.4%) and South Texas (31.7%) regions.

First-time in College

Enrollment of first-time in college students (FTIC) at the U. T. System academic institutions grew by 19.5% between fall 2000 and fall 2005, an increase of 3,588 students. Hispanic enrollment increased by 2,082 students, representing over half of the enrollment growth.

After significant increases, FTIC applications are slowing down at some institutions. In fall 2005, there are fewer first-time undergraduate applications than the previous year at U. T. Arlington, U. T. Dallas, U. T. Pan American and U. T. San Antonio.

The percent of FTIC students who were in the top 10% of their high school class continues to increase at U. T. Austin, with 63% in fall 2005. This percentage did not change at most other institutions, except U. T. San Antonio where it decreased from 7.7% in fall 2004 to 2.3% in fall 2005.

First-time in college students are predominantly female (52.1%), full-time (95.2%) and non-white, with Hispanics comprising 42.4% of the class, Asian Americans 10.3%, African Americans 5.6%, and International 3.3% in fall 2005.

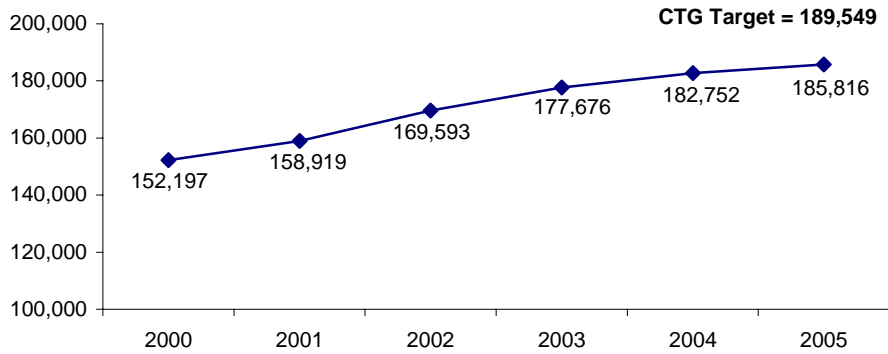
Transfers

In fall 2005 there were 12,453 undergraduate transfers entering U. T. System academic institutions. Undergraduate transfers increased by 6.2% from fall 2000.

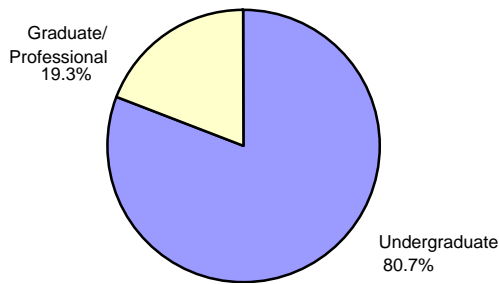
These transfer students are predominately female (55.6% in fall 2005), transferred from a Texas Junior College (62.2%), and are ethnically diverse. Almost 45% of transfers are white, 32.5% are Hispanic, 8.2% are African American and 6.8% are Asian American.

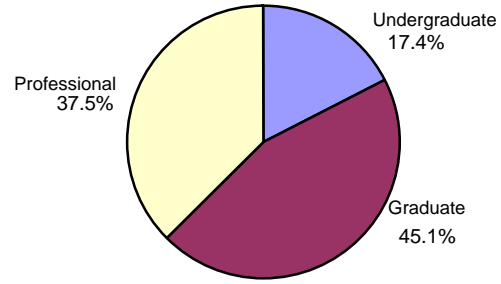
**U. T. System Total Enrollment
 Fall 2000 to Fall 2005**



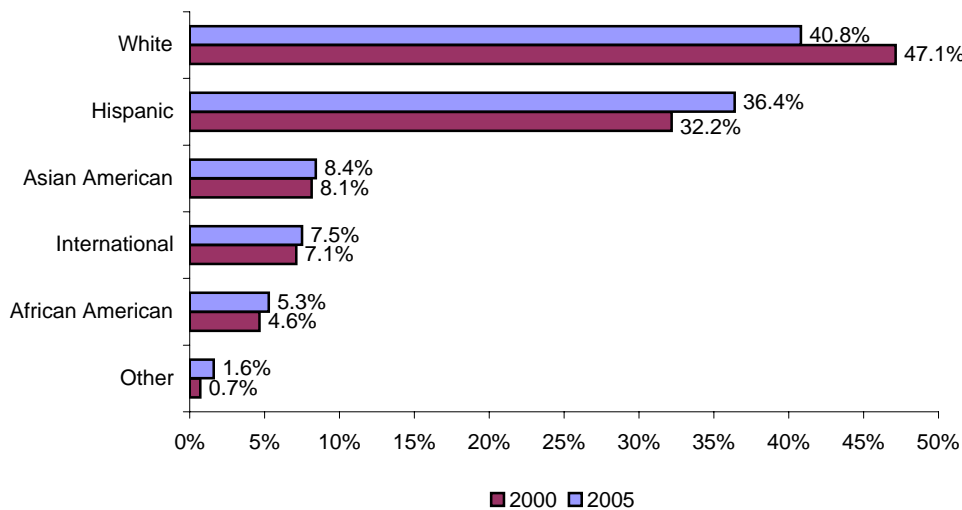
**Enrollment by Level

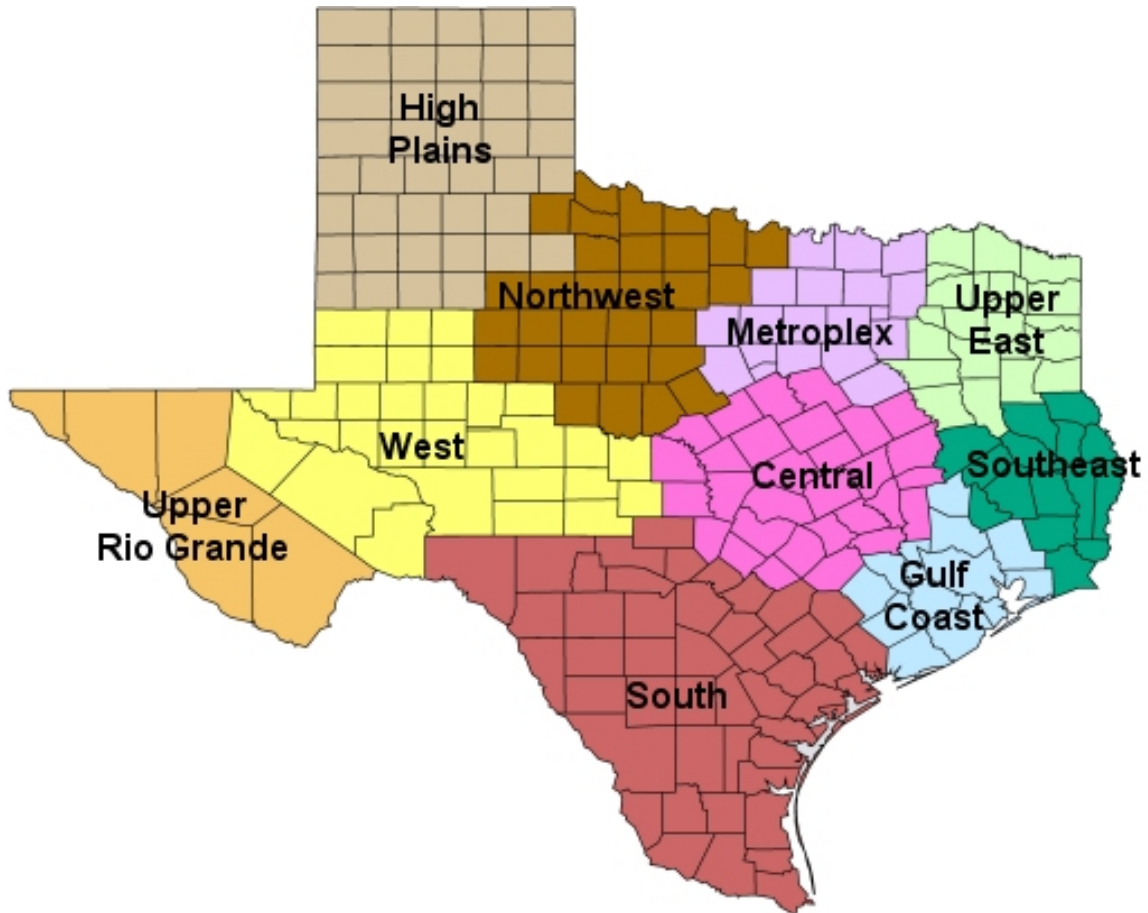

General Analysis – Persistence and Graduation

In February, 2006, the U. T. System Board of Regents passed a resolution making the improvement of graduation rates one of its highest priorities for the next decade. The information in this section provides a baseline for monitoring this improvement at the U. T. System academic institutions. Comparable data are not available for the U. T. health institutions.

The percentage of students who graduate within six years from the same institution at which they started is a traditional measure of graduation rate effectiveness.

- Over the last five years, graduation rates improved slightly for seven of the academic institutions – U. T. Arlington (to 37.6%), U. T. Austin (to 73.8%), U. T. Dallas (to 56.4%), U. T. El Paso (to 27.2%), U. T. Pan American (to 26.7%), U. T. Permian Basin (to 31.3%), and U. T. San Antonio (to 26.9%)
- The graduation rate after six years was higher for Hispanic students than white students at five academic institutions – U. T. Arlington, U. T. El Paso, U. T. Pan American, U. T. Permian Basin, and U. T. San Antonio.

The U. T. System Graduation Rate Improvement Initiative called for the nine academic U. T. System institutions to set graduation rate targets for 2010 and 2015. These targets were approved by the Board of Regents in May 2006. Using the six year graduation rate for the entering class of 1998 as a baseline, the percent improvement needed to meet the 2010 and the 2015 targets are shown in the first graph on the next page.

Graduation rate effectiveness can also be measured by the percentage of students who graduate from any Texas institution of higher education (composite graduation rate) or are still enrolled at any Texas institution after six years.

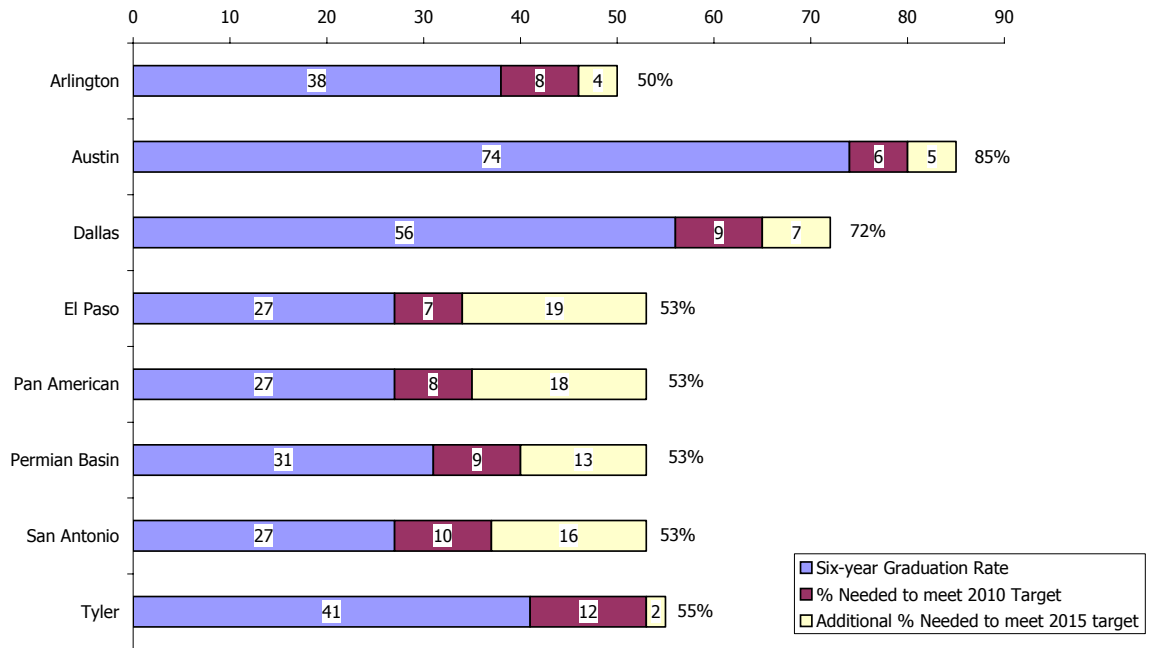
- The composite graduation rate varies widely by institution, ranging from 29.8% for U. T. El Paso to 78.0% for U. T. Austin.
- More than half of all students who started their college career at a U. T. System academic institution in 1998 had either graduated or were still enrolled in a Texas institution of higher education six years later.
- Three institutions – U. T. El Paso, U. T. Pan American, and U. T. San Antonio – have nearly 25% of their students enrolled and working toward a degree at a Texas institution six years after they entered college.

Improving the graduation rates of students who transfer from a community college is another priority of The U. T. System. The following trends are for community college transfer students entering U. T. System academic institutions with 30 or more credit hours:

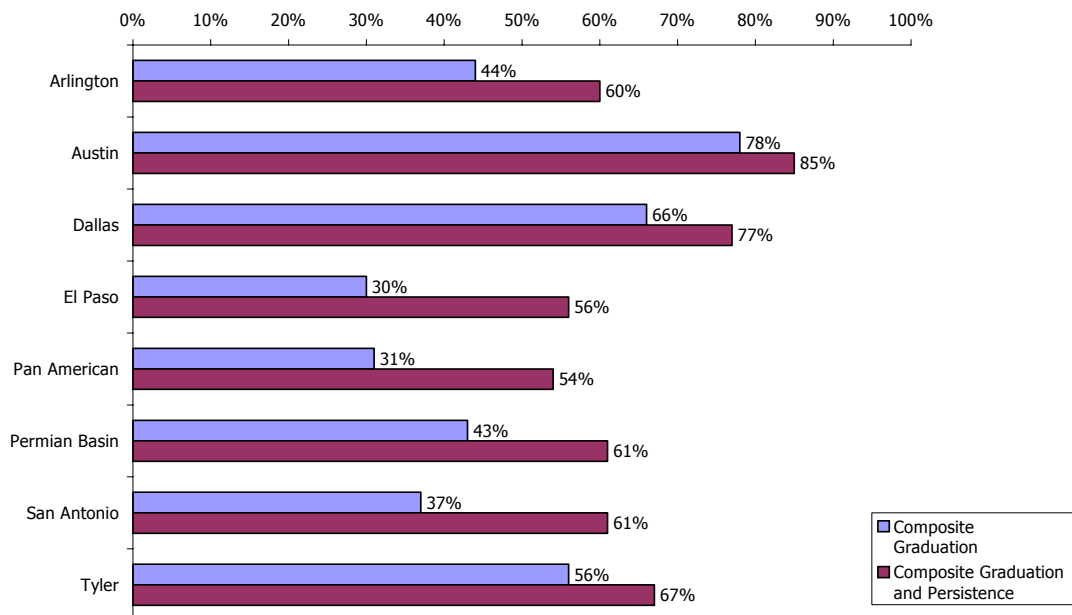
- The four-year graduation rates for transfer students improved from the entering cohort of 1996 to the entering cohort of 2000 for every institution.
- Four-year graduation rates for transfer students are as high as or higher than the six-year graduation rates for students who enter directly after high school for all academic institutions except U. T. Austin.

General Analysis – Semester Credit Hours

From fall 2001 to fall 2005, the number of semester credit hours taught at U. T. System academic institutions increased from 1.6 million to more than 1.9 million, an 18.8% increase*. Most of this increase occurred at the undergraduate level, growing from 1.4 million to almost 1.7 million semester credit hours, or 19.5%.

- The number of doctoral hours increased at the fastest rate, from 43,002 to 56,378 (31.1%).
- The number of professional credit hours decreased from 27,795 to 26,973 (-3.0%).

From fall 2001 to fall 2005, the ratio of full-time equivalent (FTE) students to FTE faculty decreased for three academic institutions, U. T. Austin, U. T. Dallas, and U. T. Pan American.

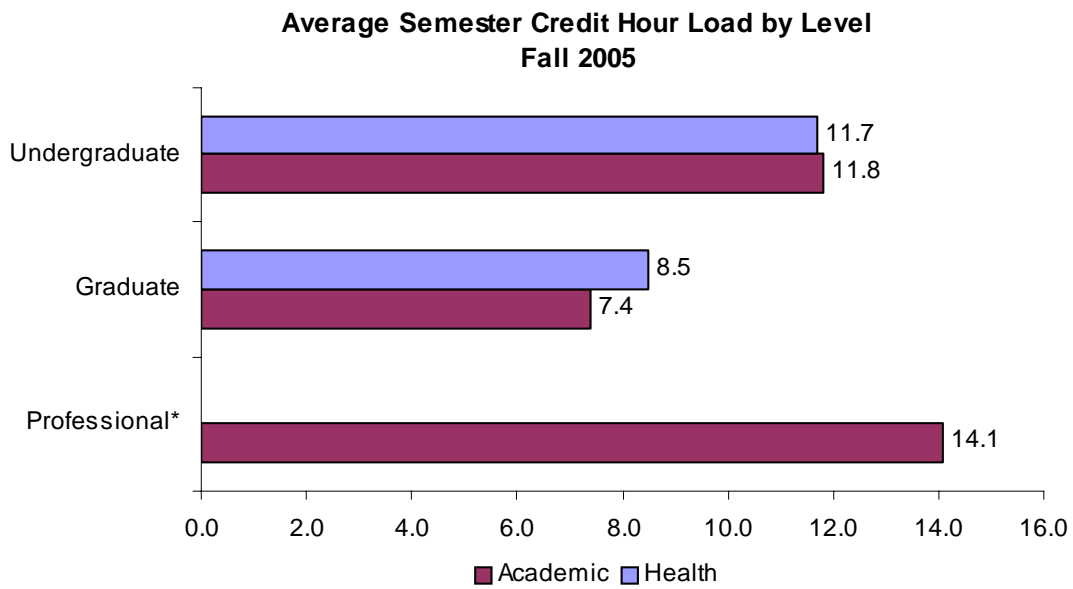
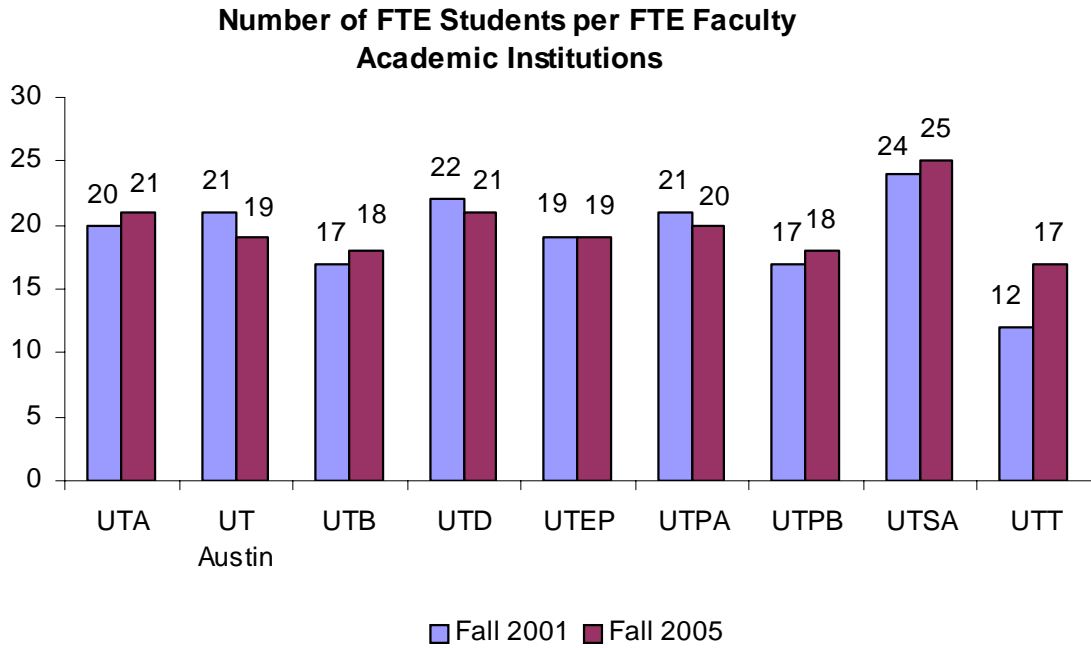
- The ratio of FTE students to FTE faculty increased from 12 to 1 (fall 2001) to 17 to 1 (fall 2005) at U. T. Tyler.
- U. T. San Antonio had the highest FTE student to FTE faculty ratio, 25 to 1, in fall 2005.

System-wide, the average student load, based on the number of semester credit hours (SCH) taken by undergraduate and graduate students, remained fairly stable from fall 2001 to fall 2005.

- At the academic institutions, the average credit load was 11.8 at the undergraduate level, 7.4 at the graduate level and 14.1 at the professional level in fall 2005.
- At the health institutions, the average load for undergraduate students decreased from 12.7 in fall 2001 to 11.7 in fall 2005. The average SCH increased slightly for graduate students, from 8.3 to 8.5 SCH.

General Analysis – Faculty & Staff

The number of faculty employed by U. T. System institutions grew from 14,166 in fall 2001 to 16,685 in fall 2005, a 17.8% increase.

At the academic institutions, the number of faculty increased from 7,805 to 9,267, an 18.7% increase, driven primarily by enrollment growth.

At the health institutions, the number of faculty increased from 6,361 to 7,418, or 16.6%. The increase in health faculty was driven by an expansion of research and clinical care activities at these institutions.

Following the national trend, the proportion of faculty in tenured/tenure-track positions (professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor) is decreasing, from 46.5% in fall 2001 to 43.9% in fall 2005.

Although the majority of faculty at U. T. System are men, the overall proportion of women increased slightly between fall 2001 and fall 2005. However, the changes varied by tenure status.

- At the academic institutions, the proportion of tenured women faculty increased from 22.7% to 24.8%, tenure-track women decreased slightly from 39.6 to 39.4%, and other professional women faculty increased from 47.9% to 50.9%.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of tenured women faculty increased slightly from 22.3% to 23.0%, tenure-track women increased from 29.8% to 32.3%, and other professional women faculty increased from 41.9% to 43.2%.

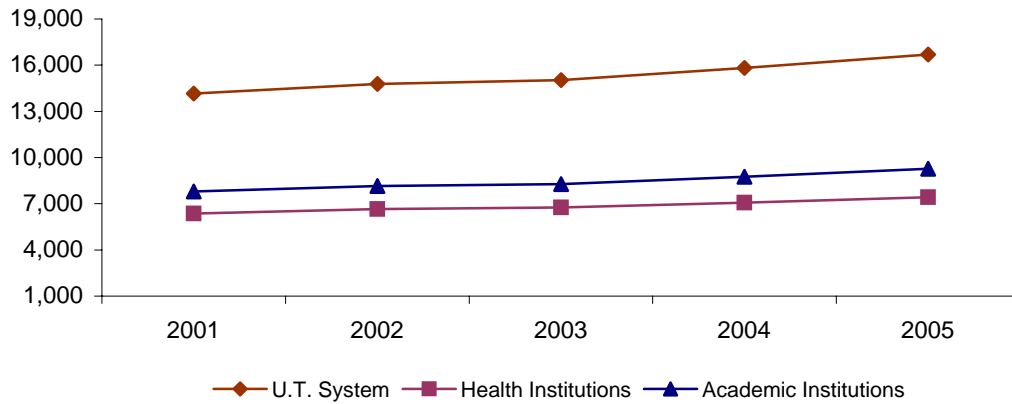
The faculty employed at both the academic and health institutions were slightly more diverse in fall 2005 than fall 2001.

- Within the academic institutions, the proportion of white faculty declined from 74.9% in 2001 to 70.9% in 2005. The representation of most of the non-white ethnic groups increased during this same time period. The proportion of African American faculty increased from 2.5% to 2.7%, Hispanic faculty increased from 12.8% to 15.1% and Asian American faculty increased from 6.4% to 7.9%. The percentage of International faculty did not change and the percentage of Native American faculty decreased slightly from .5 to .4%.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of white faculty decreased from 73.1% in 2001 to 67.4% in 2005. The proportion of African American faculty increased slightly from 3.0% to 3.1%, the Hispanic faculty increased from 6.2% to 7.1%, Asian American faculty from 16.2% to 18.8% and International faculty from 1.3% to 3.3%.

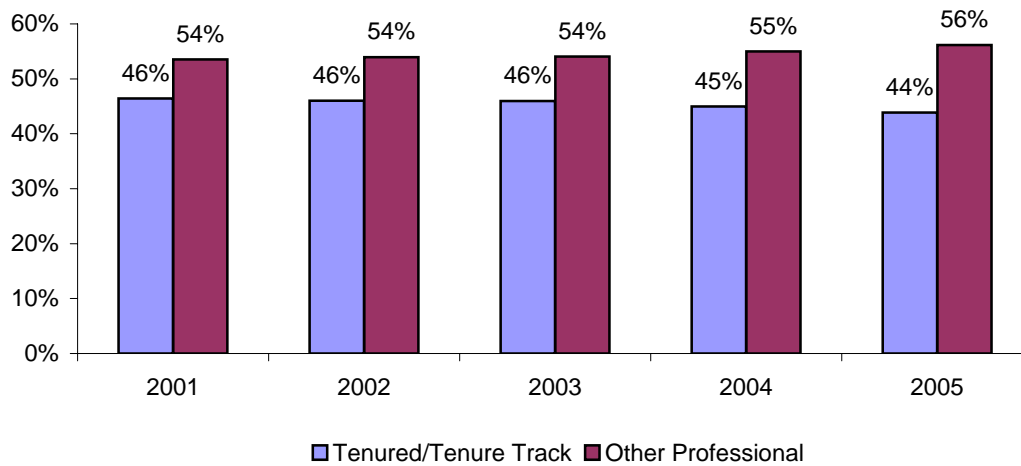
From fall 2001 to fall 2005, the number of non-faculty staff employed by U. T. System institutions grew from 70,485 to 80,342, a 14.0% increase. In fall 2005, there were 4,587 administrative staff, 57,213 other non-faculty staff and 18,542 student employees.

General Analysis – Degrees

U. T. System institutions produced over one-third of the degrees and certificates awarded by public universities and almost seven out of ten health care degrees and certificates awarded by health-related institutions in Texas.

In 2004-05, U. T. System institutions awarded 36,475 degrees and certificates, a 22.1% increase over the 2000-01 academic year.

- The number of degrees and certificates awarded at the academic institutions increased from 27,104 in 2000-01 to 33,463 in 2004-05, a 23.5% increase. Degrees awarded at the master's level grew at the fastest rate, 33.7%.
- At the health institutions the number of degrees and certificates awarded increased from 2,772 to 3,012, an 8.7% increase over the same time period.

Overall, around 56.2% of the awards went to women, a slight increase from the previous year (55.5%). At health related institutions from 2000-01 to 2004-05, the rate of growth in degrees awarded to women (13.1%) was higher than men (1.8%).

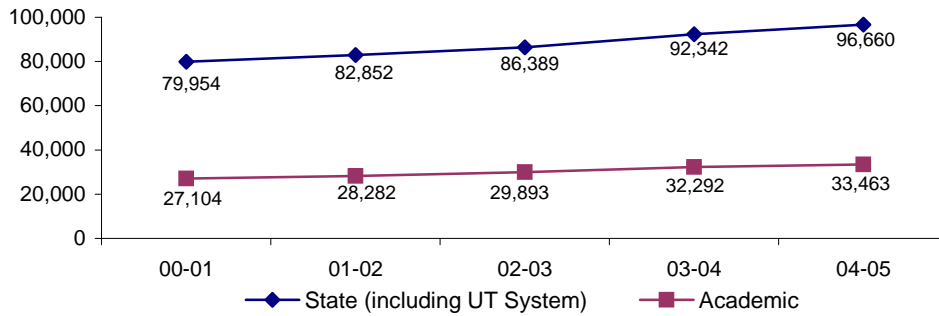
- In 2004-05, women earned 57.3% of baccalaureate degrees at the academic institutions and 75.2% of the certificates and baccalaureate degrees at the health institutions.
- At the graduate/professional level, women earned 51.9% of the awards at academic institutions and 56.3% at health institutions.

System-wide, the proportion of degrees and certificates awarded to African American, Hispanic, Asian American and International students increased over time, while the proportion awarded to white students decreased. In 2004-05, over half of the awards were to non-white and International students (51.6%), with Hispanics receiving one-fourth of the total awards (25.8%).

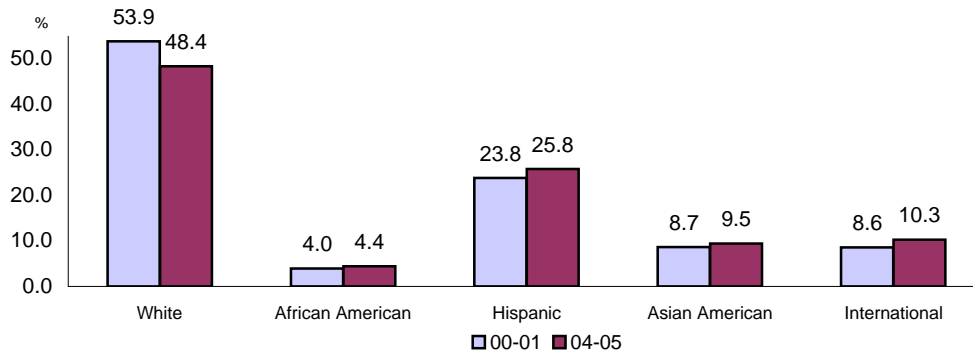
- At the undergraduate level, non-white and International students earned 51.8% of the degrees at academic institutions and 45.1% of degrees and certificates at the health institutions.
- At the graduate/professional level, non-white and International students earned 54.1% of the degrees and certificates at academic institutions and 40.2% of degrees and certificates at health institutions.

Degrees and Certificates Awarded

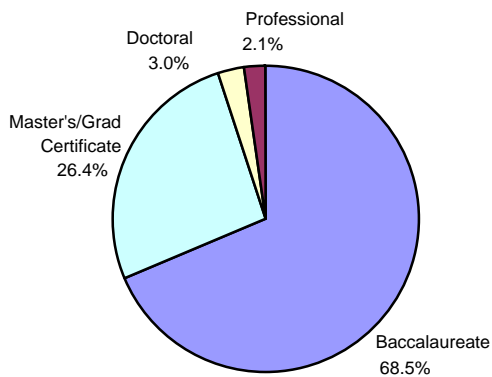
**Total Degrees and Certificates Awarded

 AY 2000-01 to 2004-05**



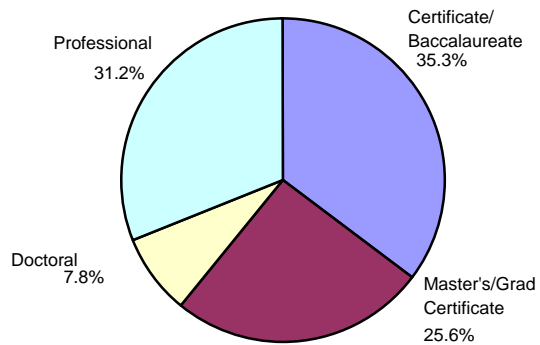
**U. T. System Degrees and Certificates

General Analysis – Finance

Major revenue sources for U. T. System institutions include contracts & grants, state appropriations, tuition & fees for the academic institutions, and sales and services of hospitals for the health institutions.

The percent of revenues from state appropriations continues to decline relative to total revenues.

- In FY 2005, state appropriations accounted for 25.2% of the academic institutions' revenue, down from 31.5% in FY 2002.
- State appropriations accounted for 14.3% of the health institutions' revenue, down from 19.6% in FY 2002.
- State appropriations in real dollars per full-time equivalent (FTE) students decreased between FY 2001 and FY 2005 at every academic institution except U. T. Austin and U. T. Brownsville/TSC.
- When adjusted for inflation, state appropriations per FTE students and FTE faculty dropped by more than 20%, on average, from FY 2001 to FY 2005.

The three largest categories of expenses are hospitals and clinics, instruction, and research.

- Operating expenses for hospitals and clinics increased from \$1.79 billion in 2002 to \$2.37 billion in 2005, a 32.6% increase.
- Expenses for instruction increased from almost \$1.72 billion in FY 2002 to \$2.11 billion in FY 2005, a 22.4% increase.
- Expenses for research increased from \$1.07 billion in FY 2002 to \$1.32 billion in FY 2005, a 22.6% increase.

Total research expenditures from all sources were almost \$1.69 billion in FY 2005, with federal research expenditures increasing by 50.2%, from over \$701 million in FY 2001 to over \$1.05 billion in FY 2005.

- Research expenditures at academic institutions increased by 40.7% and at health institutions by 55.6% during that same time period.

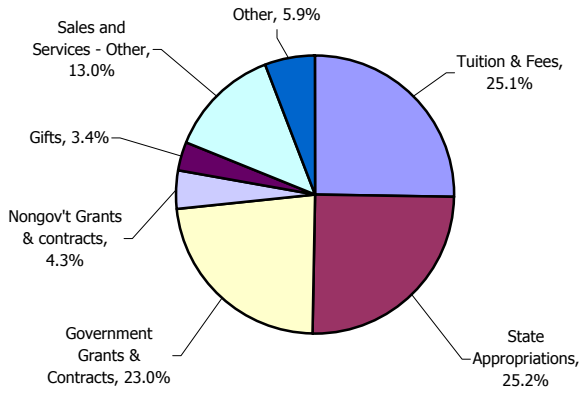
In FY 2005, financial aid awards to undergraduates at our academic institutions exceeded \$767 million, up from \$738 million in FY 2004.

From fall 2004 to fall 2005, average academic costs for full time resident undergraduates increased by less than \$150 for nine of the 14 System institutions.

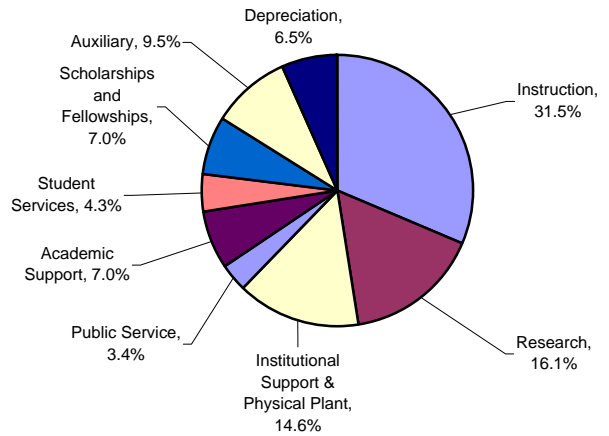
The amount of money expended for administrative costs relative to total expenses was 7.8% for academic institutions and 5.7% at health institutions in FY 2005.

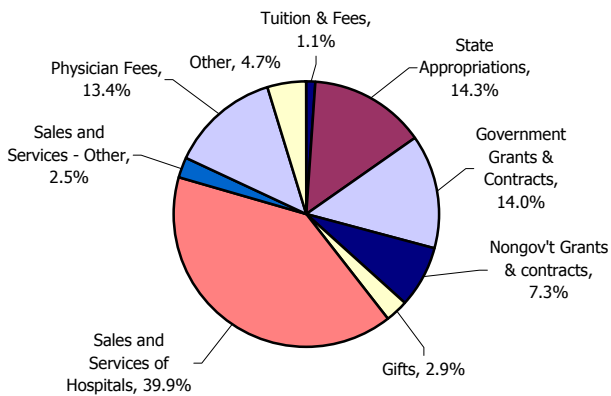
**Academic Institutions
 Key Revenues, FY 2005**



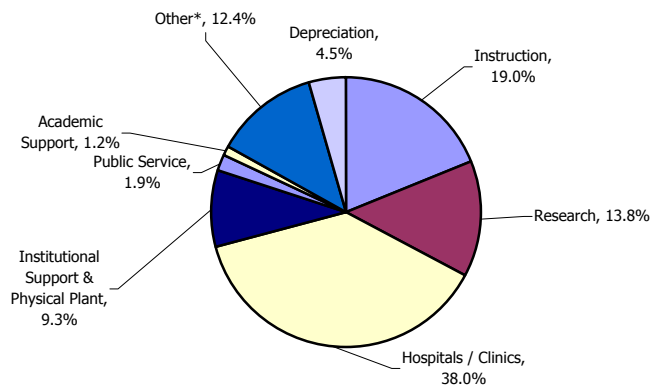
**Academic Institutions

 Key Revenues, FY 2005**

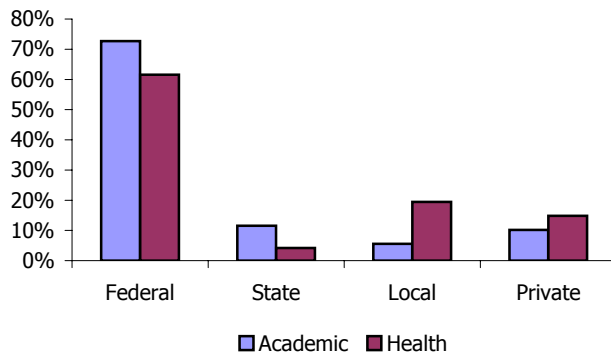

 Key Expenses, FY 2005**

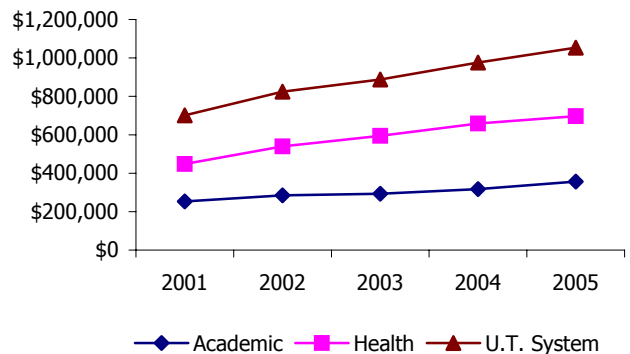
