Preface

The *Statistical Handbook* is designed as a reference document with basic enrollment, persistence and graduation, faculty, staff, degree, semester credit hour and financial information for the nine academic and six health-related institutions and The University of Texas System as a whole. Where available, data are reported for the most recent six years so that trends can be identified.

Data reported by the U. T. System institutions to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board have been used extensively in this publication. However, these data may vary somewhat from information presented and used internally by individual institutions due to differences in management information systems, data definitions, and intended application.

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General Analysis – Enrollment

In 1999 the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) published the first *Closing the Gaps (CTG)* report and challenged colleges and universities in the state of Texas to increase the number of students participating in higher education. U. T. System met this challenge by increasing both the number and diversity of its student body by the first benchmark in 2005. In order to meet the 2010 target of 205,523 students, total enrollment at U. T. System must increase by almost 2% per year for the next four years.

Enrollment Trends

In fall 2006, total enrollment at U. T. System institutions was 190,903 students, an increase of 31,984 students (20.1%) from fall 2001 and 5,087 students (2.7%) from fall 2005.

- Enrollment at academic institutions was 179,668, an increase of 30,229 students (20.2%) since fall 2001 and 4,822 students (2.8%) since fall 2005.
- Enrollment at health institutions was 11,235, an increase of 1,755 students (18.5%) since fall 2001 and 265 students (2.4%) since fall 2005.

From fall 2001 to fall 2006, undergraduate enrollment at all U. T. System institutions grew by 20.1%, graduate enrollment grew by 22.6% and professional enrollment grew by 6.8%. At the academic institutions, the proportion of undergraduates remained about the same as in fall 2001, around 81%. At the health institutions, there are more graduate students in fall 2006 than professional students, 44.9% and 37.9%, respectively.

Overall, gender distributions at U. T. System remained fairly steady, with male enrollment around 46% and female enrollment around 54%. There has been, however, a slight increase in the percentage of women attending the health institutions, from 58.5% in fall 2001 to 60.1% in fall 2006.

Ethnic distributions at the institutions continue to change as the population of Texas becomes more diverse.

- System-wide, the percentage of white students decreased from 45.4% in fall 2001 to 39.8% in fall 2006.
- At the academic institutions, the percentage of African American students increased slightly, and the Hispanic population increased from 33.8% to 38.9%.
- At the health institutions, the International population increased from 6.1% to 11.8%.

U. T. System institutions also serve diverse regions throughout Texas.

- The highest enrollments at academic institutions are from regions that include the major population centers in the state - South Texas (38.3%), the Metroplex (22.6%), the Gulf Coast (11.5%) and the Upper Rio Grande (11.3%). From fall 2001 to fall 2006, the proportion of students from the South Texas region increased slightly from 36.0% to 38.3%, while the proportion of students from the Metroplex region decreased from 24.4% to 22.6%.

- The highest percentage of students at the health institutions come from the Gulf Coast (47.8%) and South Texas (31.2%) regions. From fall 2001 to fall 2006, the proportion of students from the Metroplex region increased from 38.8% to 47.8%, while the proportion of students from the South Texas region decreased from 39.5% to 31.2%.

First-time in College

Enrollment of first-time in college students (FTIC) at the U. T. System academic institutions grew by 23.0% between fall 2001 and fall 2006, an increase of 4,357 students. Hispanic enrollment increased by 1,882 students, representing 43% of the enrollment growth. African American enrollment had the highest percentage increase (68.1%), from 777 to 1306, an increase of 529 students.

After experiencing a decline in fall 2005, there was an increase in FTIC applications at most U. T. System institutions in fall 2006. FTIC applications were up at U. T. Arlington, U. T. Austin, U. T. El Paso, U. T. Pan American and U. T. San Antonio.

The percent of FTIC enrolled students who were in the top 10% of their high school class continues to increase at U. T. Austin, with 71.1% in fall 2006. At other U. T. System institutions, the top 10% represented less than a third of FTIC enrolled students from Texas.

First-time in college students are predominantly female (52.0%), full-time (95.5%) and non-white, with Hispanics comprising 41.3% of the class, Asian Americans 10.9%, African Americans 5.6%, and International 3.4% in fall 2006.

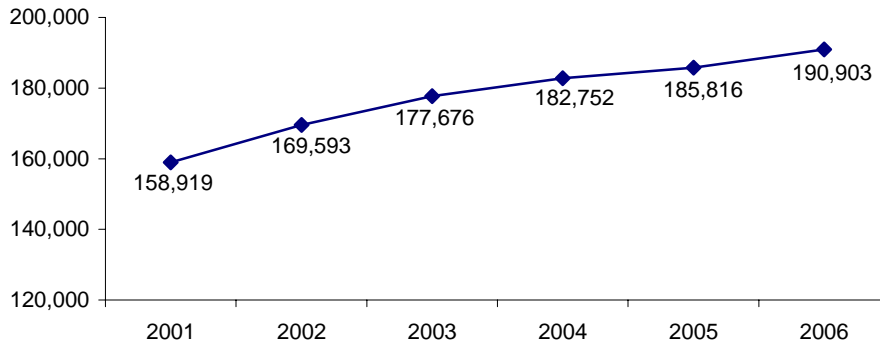
Transfers

Transfer enrollment has remained relatively unchanged since fall 2001. There were 12,130 undergraduate transfers entering U. T. System academic institutions in fall 2006.

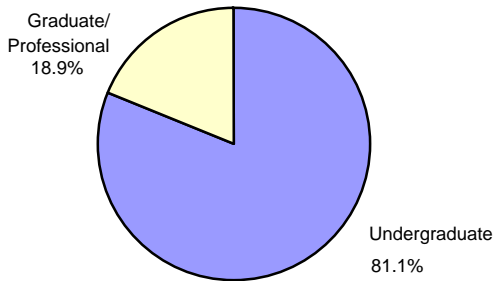
Transfer students are predominantly female (55.2% in fall 2006), transferred from a Texas community college (63.4%), and are ethnically diverse. About 46% of transfers are white, 33.6% are Hispanic, 6.0% are African American and 7.3% are Asian American.

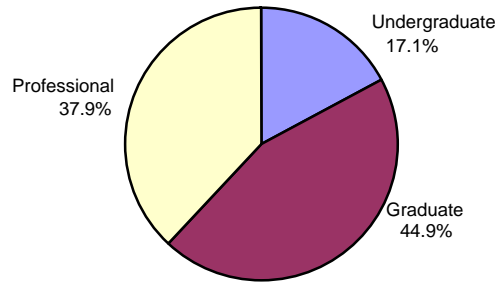
**U. T. System Total Enrollment
 Fall 2001 to Fall 2006**



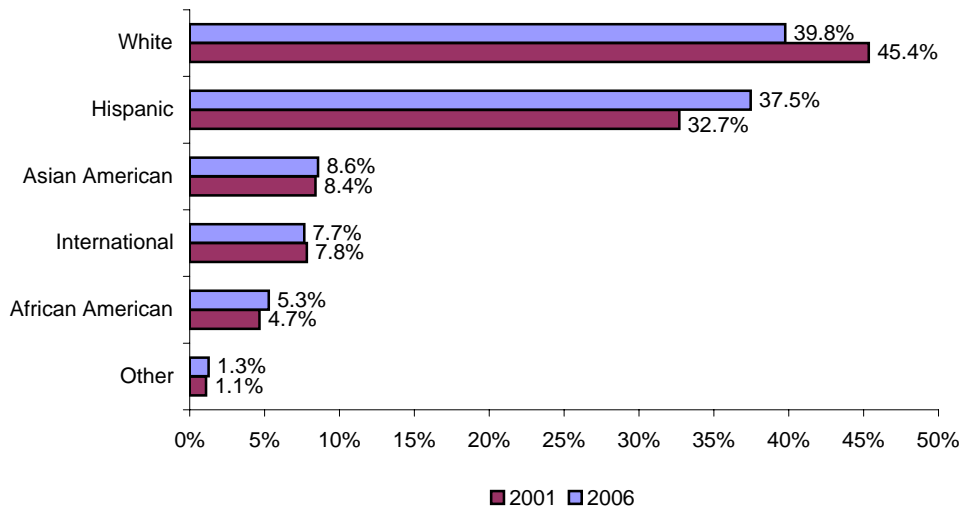
**Enrollment by Level

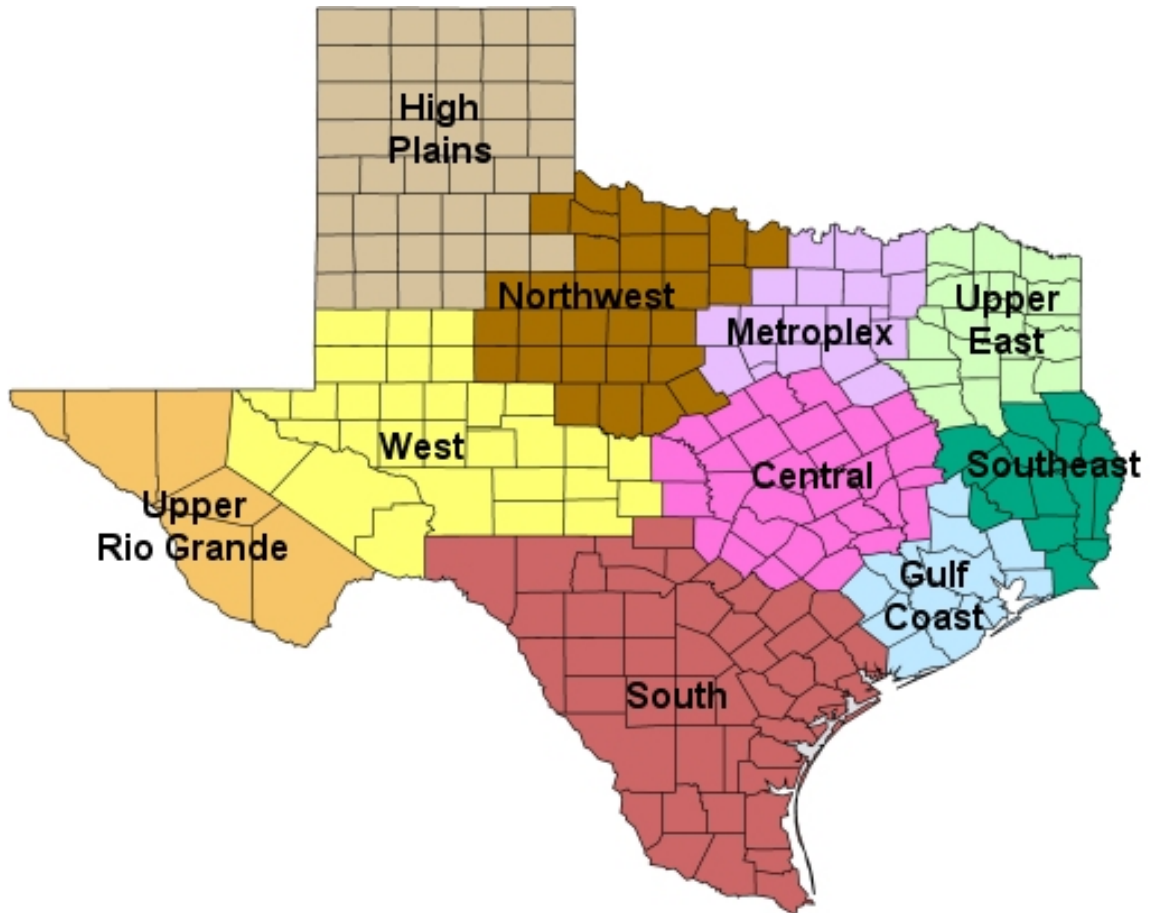

General Analysis – Persistence and Graduation

In February, 2006, the U. T. System Board of Regents passed a resolution making the improvement of graduation rates one of its highest priorities for the next decade.

The U. T. System Graduation Rate Improvement Initiative called for the nine academic institutions to set graduation rate targets for 2010 and 2015. These targets were approved by the Board of Regents in May 2006. While the impact of this initiative cannot be fully measured until the entering class of fall 2006 graduates, most institutions are improving their retention and graduation rates and should attain the 2010 targets if improvements of around 2% per year are sustained.

- Over the last six years, first-year persistence rates increased at six institutions – U. T. Austin, U. T. Dallas, U. T. El Paso, U. T. Pan American, U. T. Permian Basin, and U. T. San Antonio, with increases ranging from 1% to 11%.
- Four academic institutions improved their 4-year graduation rate – U. T. Arlington, U. T. Austin, U. T. El Paso and U. T. Tyler.
- Six academic institutions improved their 5-year graduation rate – U. T. Arlington, U. T. Austin, U. T. El Paso, U. T. Permian Basin, U. T. San Antonio and U. T. Tyler.
- Seven academic institutions improved their 6-year graduation rate – U. T. Arlington, U. T. Austin, U. T. El Paso, U. T. Pan American, U. T. Permian Basin, U. T. San Antonio and U. T. Tyler.

Graduation rate effectiveness can also be measured by the percentage of students who graduate from any Texas institution of higher education (composite graduation rate) or are still enrolled at any Texas institution after six years.

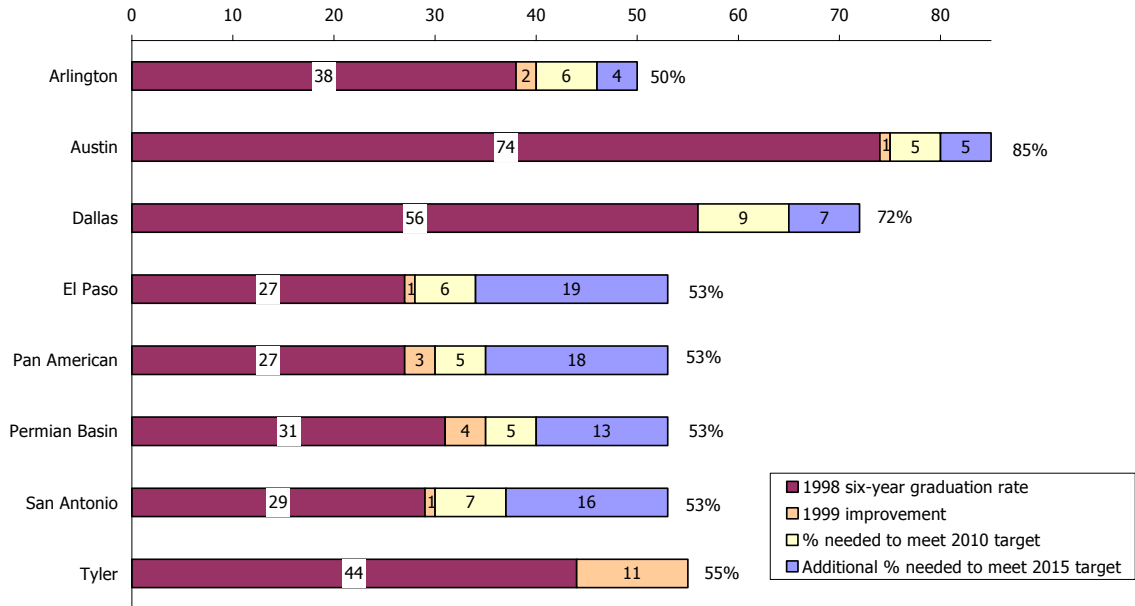
- More than half of all students who started their college career at a U. T. System academic institution in 1999 had either graduated or were still enrolled in a Texas institution of higher education six years later.
- Three institutions – U. T. El Paso, U. T. Pan American, and U. T. San Antonio – have from 20 to 25% of their students enrolled and working toward a degree at a Texas institution six years after they entered college.

Improving the graduation rates of students who transfer from a community college is another priority of the U. T. System. The following trends are for community college transfer students entering U. T. System academic institutions with 30 or more credit hours:

- The four-year graduation rates for transfer students improved from the entering cohort of 1996 to the entering cohort of 2001 at seven academic institutions.
- Except for U. T. Austin and U. T. Tyler, four-year graduation rates for transfer students are typically higher than the six-year graduation rates for students who enter directly after high school.

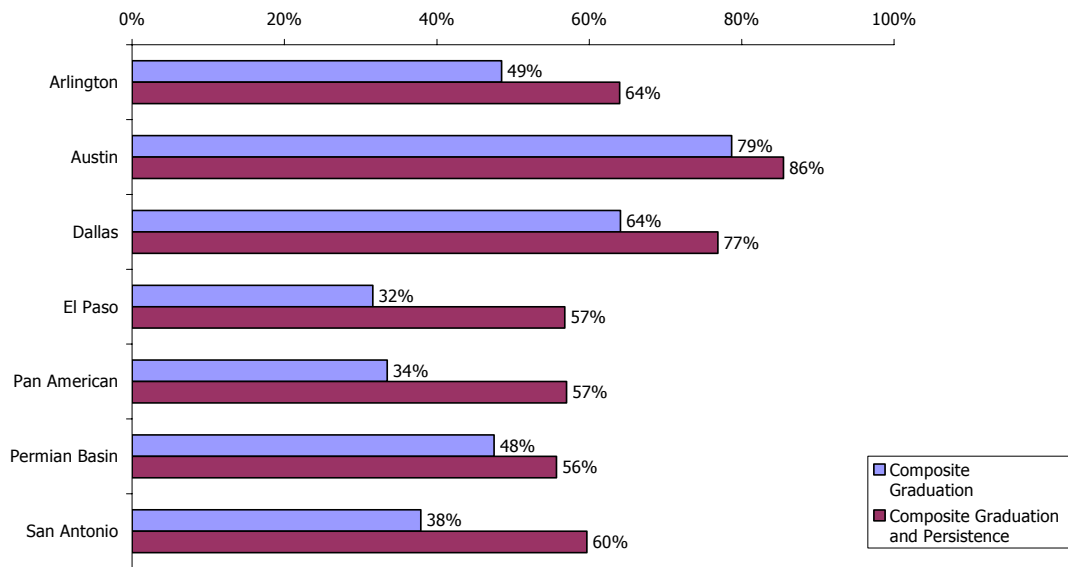

General Analysis – Semester Credit Hours

From fall 2001 to fall 2006, the number of semester credit hours taught at U. T. System academic institutions increased from 1.6 million to nearly 2.0 million, a 21.3% increase*. Most of this increase occurred at the undergraduate level, growing from 1.4 million to 1.7 million semester credit hours, or 22.5%.

- The number of doctoral hours increased at the fastest rate, from 43,002 to 56,611 (31.6%).
- The number of professional credit hours decreased from 27,795 to 25,302 (-9.0%).

From fall 2001 to fall 2006, the ratio of full-time equivalent (FTE) students to FTE faculty decreased for U. T. Austin and U. T. Dallas and stayed the same at U. T. Arlington. The ratio of students to faculty increased at all the other U. T. System academic institutions.

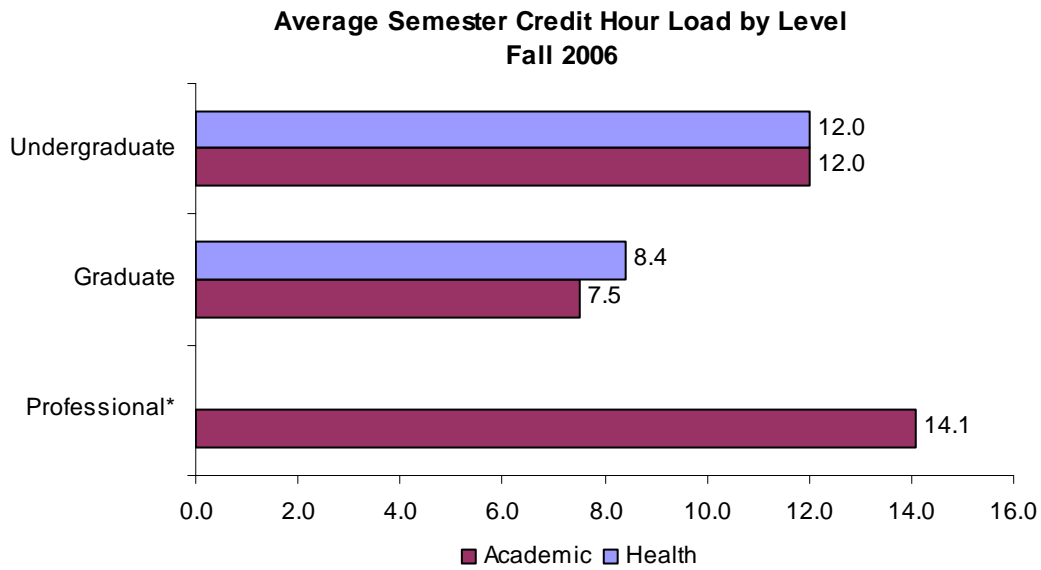
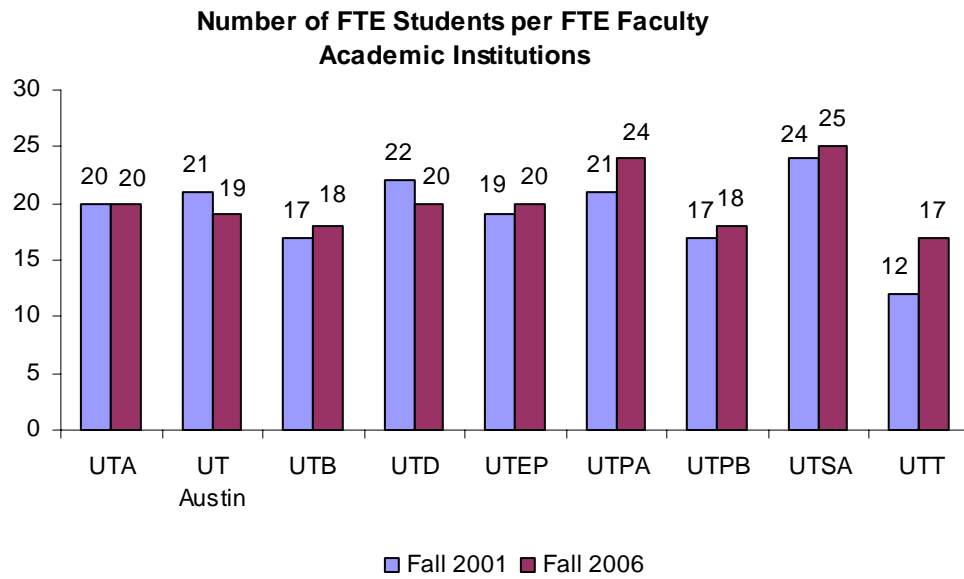
- U. T. Pan American had the largest annual increase with ratios going from 20 to 1 (fall 2005) to 24 to 1 (fall 2006). However, this increase was a result of U. T. Pan American reducing the proportion of faculty members' assignments from direct instruction to more accurately reflect research and public service expectations.
- U. T. Tyler experienced the largest increase going from 12 to 1 (fall 2001) to 17 to 1 (fall 2006).
- U. T. San Antonio had the highest FTE student to FTE faculty ratio, 25 to 1, in fall 2006.

Undergraduate students at the academic institutions are taking more semester credit hours. From fall 2001 to fall 2006, the average SCH for undergraduate students increased from 11.6 to 12.0. The average SCH decreased at the graduate level, from 7.6 to 7.5, and at the professional level from 14.5 to 14.1.

- The average undergraduate credit load increased at U. T. Arlington, U. T. Austin, U. T. Brownsville, U. T. Dallas, U. T. Pan American, U. T. Permian Basin, U. T. San Antonio and U. T. Tyler.
- At the health institutions, the average credit load for undergraduate students decreased from 12.7 in fall 2001 to 12.0 in fall 2006. The average SCH increased slightly for graduate students, from 8.3 to 8.4 SCH.

General Analysis – Faculty & Staff

The number of faculty employed by U. T. System institutions grew from 14,166 in fall 2001 to 17,158 in fall 2006, a 21.1% increase.

At the academic institutions, the number of faculty increased from 7,805 to 9,539, a 22.2% increase, driven primarily by enrollment growth.

At the health institutions, the number of faculty increased from 6,361 to 7,619, or 19.8%. The increase in health faculty was driven by enrollment increases and the expansion of research and clinical care activities at these institutions.

Following the national trend, the proportion of faculty in tenured/tenure-track positions (professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor) is decreasing, from 46.5% in fall 2001 to 43.3% in fall 2006.

Although the majority of faculty at U. T. System are men, the overall proportion of women increased between fall 2001 and fall 2006.

- At the academic institutions, the proportion of women faculty increased at all levels; from 22.7% to 24.7% for tenured women, from 39.6 to 41.4% for tenure-track women, and from 47.9% to 51.6% for other professional women.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of women faculty also increased at all levels. The proportion of tenured women increased slightly from 22.3% to 23.3%, tenure-track women increased from 29.8% to 33.1%, and other professional women faculty increased from 41.9% to 43.6%.

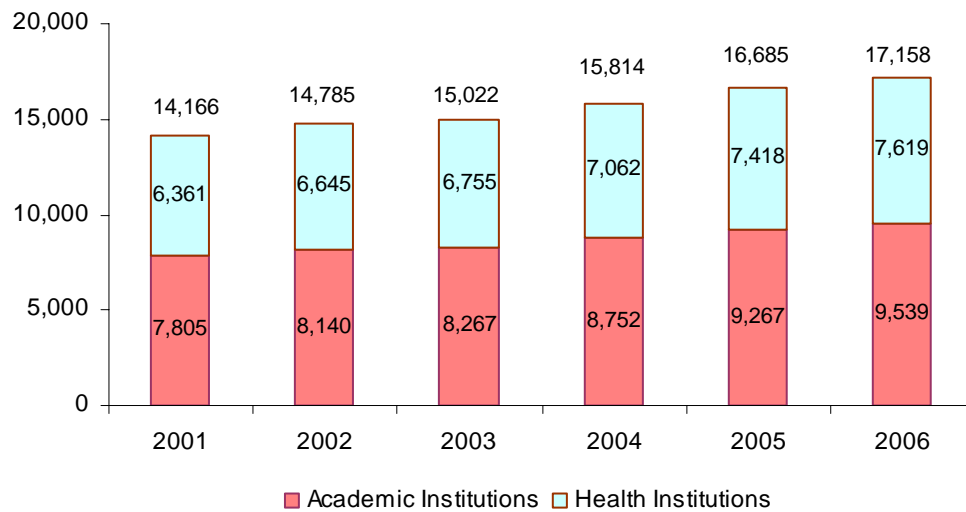
The faculty employed at both the academic and health institutions were slightly more diverse in fall 2006 than fall 2001.

- Within the academic institutions, the proportion of white faculty declined from 74.9% in 2001 to 69.7% in 2006. The representation of most of the non-white ethnic groups increased during this same time period. The proportion of African American faculty increased from 2.5% to 2.7%, Hispanic faculty increased from 12.8% to 15.3% and Asian American faculty increased from 6.4% to 8.0%. The percentage of International faculty increased from 2.9 percent to 3.7 percent and the percentage of Native American faculty stayed the same at 0.5 percent.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of white faculty decreased from 73.1% in 2001 to 66.5% in 2006. The proportion of African American faculty increased slightly from 3.0% to 3.1%, the Hispanic faculty increased from 6.2% to 7.0%, Asian American faculty from 16.2% to 19.6% and International faculty from 1.3% to 3.6%.

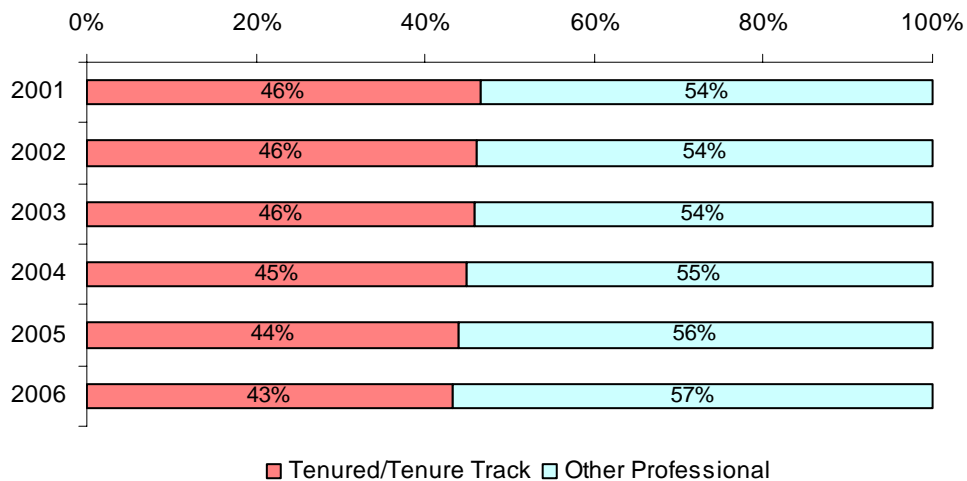
From fall 2001 to fall 2006, the number of non-faculty staff employed by U. T. System institutions grew from 70,485 to 82,246, a 16.7% increase. In fall 2006, there were 4,785 administrative staff, 58,193 other non-faculty staff and 19,268 student employees.

General Analysis – Degrees

System institutions produce over one-third of the degrees and certificates awarded by public universities and almost seven out of ten health care degrees and certificates awarded by health-related institutions in Texas.

In 2005-06, U. T. System institutions awarded 38,282 degrees and certificates, an increase of 8,406 degrees or 28.1% over the 2000-01 academic year.

- The number of degrees and certificates awarded at the academic institutions increased from 27,104 in 2000-01 to 35,243 in 2005-06, a 30.0% increase. Degrees awarded at the master's level are growing at the fastest rate, 34.8%.
- At the health institutions, the number of degrees and certificates awarded increased from 2,772 to 3,039, a 9.6% increase over the same time period.

Overall, around 56.2% of the awards went to women, about the same as the previous year. The growth rate of degrees awarded at health related institutions from 2000-01 to 2005-06, increased for women (by 17.7%) and decreased for men (by -2.6%).

- In 2005-06, women earned 57.0% of baccalaureate degrees at the academic institutions and 73.6% of the certificates and baccalaureate degrees at the health institutions.
- At the graduate/professional level, women earned 51.8% of the awards at academic institutions and 60.3% at health institutions.

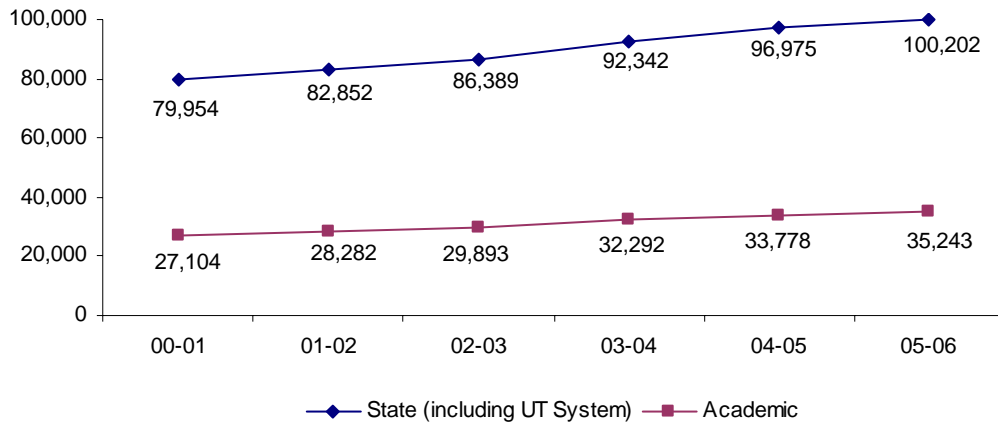
System-wide, the proportion of degrees and certificates awarded to African American, Hispanic, Asian American and International students increased over time, while the proportion awarded to white students decreased. In 2005-06, over half of the awards were to non-white and International students (53.2%), with Hispanics receiving more than one-fourth of the total awards (27.1%).

- At the undergraduate level, non-white and International students earned 53.2% of the degrees at academic institutions and 49.7% of degrees and certificates at the health institutions.
- At the graduate/professional level, non-white and International students earned 55.8% of the degrees and certificates at academic institutions and 40.7% of degrees and certificates at health institutions.

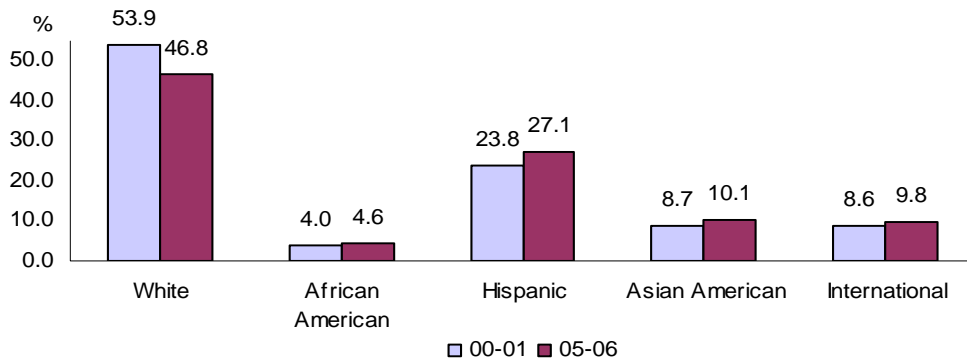
With an increased emphasis nationally in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), U. T. System contributed to these degrees at every level. In 2005, 23.8% of baccalaureate, 24.2% of master's and 43.0% of doctoral degrees awarded at U. T. System academic institutions were in a STEM field. Overall, almost one out of four degrees awarded at U. T. System academic institutions was a STEM degree (24.5%), a higher percentage than other public universities in Texas (19.2%) and the nation (19.0%).

Degrees and Certificates Awarded

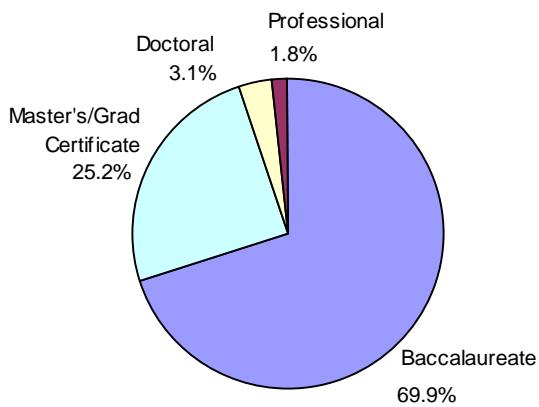
**Total Degrees and Certificates Awarded at U. T. System Academic Institutions and all Texas Public Universities
 AY 2000-01 to 2005-06**



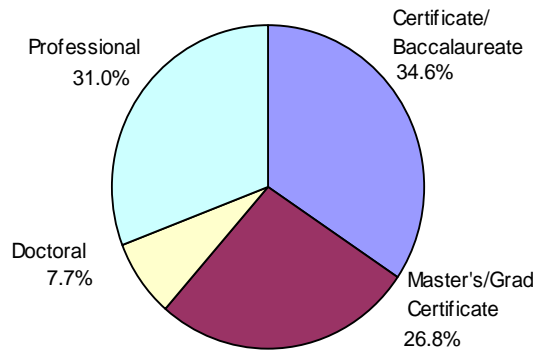
**U. T. System Degrees and Certificates

General Analysis – Finance

Major revenue sources for U. T. System institutions include contracts & grants, state appropriations, tuition & fees for the academic institutions, and sales and services of hospitals for the health institutions.

The percent of revenues from state appropriations continues to decline relative to total revenues.

- In FY 2006, state appropriations accounted for 25.3% of the academic institutions' revenue, down from 31.5% in FY 2002.
- State appropriations accounted for 14.9% of the health institutions' revenue, down from 19.6% in FY 2002.
- State appropriations in real dollars per full-time equivalent (FTE) students decreased between FY 2002 and FY 2006 at every academic institution except U. T. Austin, U. T. Brownsville and U. T. Dallas.
- When adjusted for inflation, state appropriations per FTE students and FTE faculty dropped by about 18%, on average, from FY 2002 to FY 2006.

The three largest categories of expenses are hospitals and clinics, instruction, and research.

- Operating expenses for hospitals and clinics increased from \$1.79 billion in 2002 to \$2.51 billion in 2006, a 40.5% increase.
- Expenses for instruction increased from almost \$1.72 billion in FY 2002 to \$2.26 billion in FY 2006, a 31.0% increase.
- Expenses for research increased from \$1.07 billion in FY 2002 to \$1.44 billion in FY 2006, a 33.5% increase.

Total research expenditures from all sources were \$1.84 billion in FY 2006, with federal research expenditures increasing by 35.4%, from over \$824 million in FY 2002 to over \$1.12 billion in FY 2006.

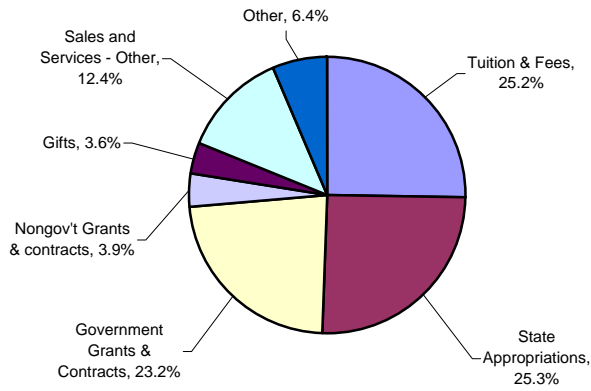
- Federal research expenditures at academic institutions increased by 37.6% and at health institutions by 34.2% during that same time period.

In FY 2006, financial aid awards to undergraduates at our academic institutions exceeded \$926 million, up from \$767 million in FY 2005.

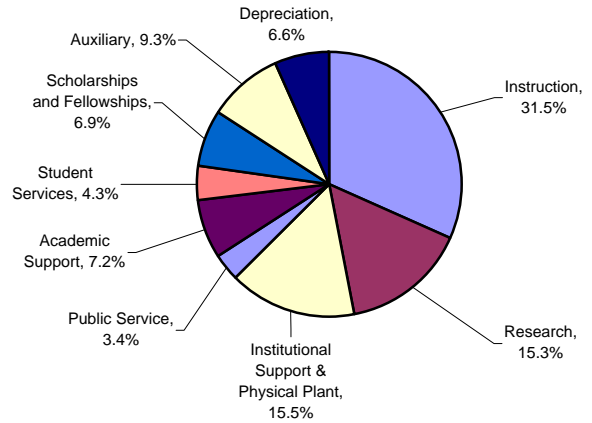
The amount of money expended for administrative costs relative to total expenses was 7.9% for academic institutions and 5.7% at health institutions in FY 2006.

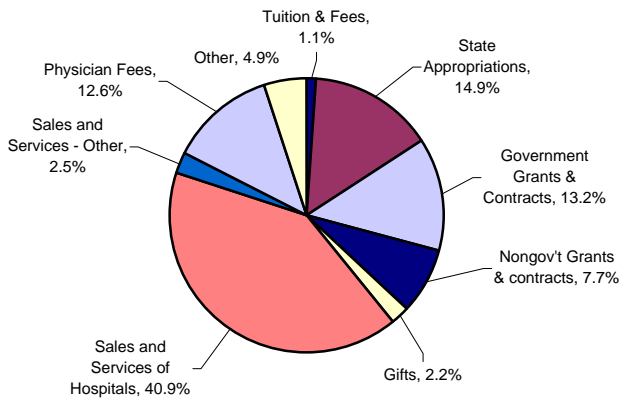
**Academic Institutions
 Key Revenues, FY 2006**



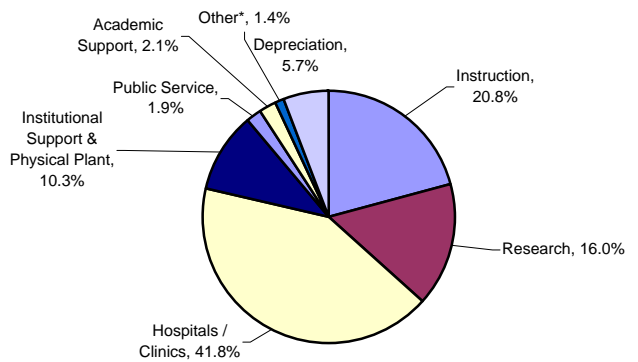
**Academic Institutions

 Key Revenues, FY 2006**

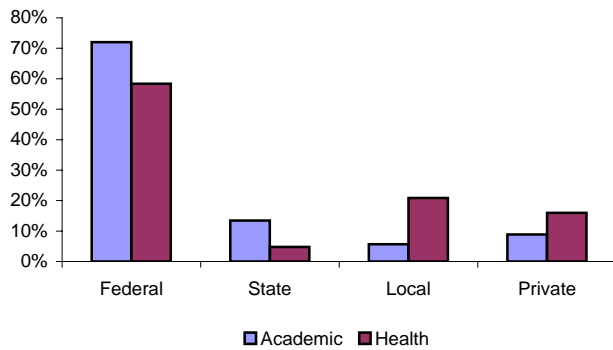

 Key Expenses, FY 2006**

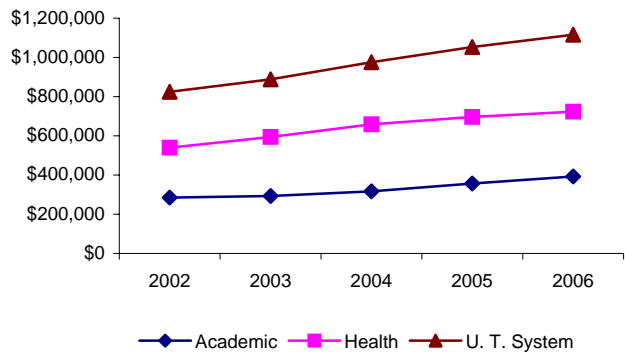
