# Why CTE Dual Enrollment?

- Put students on path to credential/degree completion
  - 65% of jobs by 2020 req. training after HS
  - Ambitious state PS attainment goals

Save families \$

 Aspiration-setting, affirming for students unsure of post-HS plans

#### **Outcomes of CTE Dual Enrollment**

Students more likely than non-DE CTE peers to:


- Graduate HS
- Enroll and persist in PS

Outcomes on some measures even stronger for males, low-income and lower-achieving students.
