The dockets prepared by the component institutions listed below are herewith submitted, with my recommendation for approval, for consideration at the meeting of the Board of Regents in Houston on October 21-22, 1960:

Listed below are Central Administration items which I recommend be approved:

#### 1960-61 Budget

##### University Development Board

1. Transfer \$1,000 from Etter Estate undistributed income to the Development Board Supplemental Traveling Expenses and Entertainment Fund, Account No. 81650. This fund, supported entirely from private sources, was originally established by Regental action.

##### Office of the Comptroller

2. Terminate the appointment of Mr. Ben F. Edwards, employed on a monthly basis since November 16, 1959, as clerk-of-the-works on the Main University Business Administration-Economics Building, at a salary of \$541.67 per month, effective at close of business on October 5, 1960.
3. Appoint Mr. Wesley E. Griffin starting September 20, 1960, to succeed Mr. Edwards (Item 2 above) as clerk-of-the-works at a monthly salary of \$600., to be paid from the Architectural Supervision account for the project. Mr. Griffin has had previous experience as clerk-of-the-works on Kinsolving Dormitory. His appointment overlaps his predecessor's to allow for Mr. Edwards' earned vacation.
4. Appoint Mr. (Grover) Gale Williford starting August 15, 1960, as clerk-of-the-works on the Classroom-Office Building at Texas Western College at a monthly salary of \$475 to be paid from the Architectural Supervision account for this building. The employment is to continue until further notice; the initial period of employment in August 1960 occurs in the 1959-60 budget year.
5. Delete the appointment of Mr. Halbert G. St.Clair, Branch College Auditor at \$8,520 per year, effective September 1, 1960. Mr. St.Clair resigned from this position to accept appointment as Business Manager of Texas Western College for 1960-61.

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CONTRACT CHANGE RELATING TO MCDONALD OBSERVATORY

Amendment to Agreement between Harvard College Observatory, Texas State Parks Board, West Texas Utilities Company, McDonald Observatory, The University of Texas, by which the electric service maximum load to be imposed upon the McDonald Observatory line by the system to be constructed by the Harvard College Observatory shall be increased from 25 KVA to 50 KVA under certain specified conditions. The Amendment was signed by Chancellor Wilson on behalf of the University on the recommendation of University Attorney Waldrep.

GIFT FOR EDUCATIONAL TELEVISION-CHANNEL 9

Murphy & Murphy, Inc., of Mineral Wells, Texas, has given \$300 to be used for Educational Television, Channel 9. The Development Board recommends acceptance and deposit of the money to Account No. 81808, Educational Television - Various Donors-Variou Purposes.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: I recommend approval of the following legislation passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Council:

1. The Faculty Council on September 15, 1960, approved by the circularization procedure the recommendations of the College of Education to make changes in the requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education. These changes decrease the requirements in the fields of education, music, art, health and physical education to allow additional hours in the teaching of the basic subjects and hence better balance in the program. They increase the required number of semester hours of advanced work and include a new requirement of an 18 semester-hour planned concentration designed to add academic depth to the college program of the student and to provide a strong teaching foundation for the prospective teacher (D&P 2844-46).

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RESEARCH CONTRACTS: The following contracts and amendments have been negotiated by the Office of Government Sponsored Research and have been signed by the Vice-President and/or President upon the recommendation of the appropriate Technical Director, the Director of the Office of Government Sponsored Research, and the Business Manager. 




