GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

1. Modification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 30(602)-4246, by which the Department of the Air Force, Headquarters Rome Air Development Center (AFSC), Griffiss Air Force Base, New York, increases the contract sum by \$77,334. to a new total of \$382,164. Of the \$77,334 sum, \$67,000 is funded at this time for the period through September 30, 1968. The research on "Russian-English Machine Translation on a Syntactic Level" continues under the direction of Dr. W. P. Lehmann, Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and Linguistics.
2. Modification No. 3(68-1389), Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF33(657)-11073, by which the Department of the Air Force, Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, adds the sum of \$458.83 to the contract funds, making \$96,458.83 the total amount allotted under the contract. The research on plasma diagnostic methods for high temperature plasma research was conducted under the direction of Dr. A. A. Dougal, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
3. 6. Grant DAHC15 68 G3, by which the Department of the Army, Defense Supply Service-Washington, Washington, D. C. provides the sum of \$5,000 for partial support of an International Conference on the Metal Non-metal Transition. The grant is effective beginning November 20, 1967, and the conference will be directed by Dr. James C. Thompson, Professor of Physics.

Revised Grant 5-P01-GMI1609-04, by which the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, reduces the supplies item by \$5,397 and the indirect costs by \$1,079 during the period September 1, 1966, through August 31, 1967. The research entitled "Evolutionary, Chemical and Radiation Genetics" continues under the direction of Dr. Wilson S. Stone, Professor of Zoology.
47. Revised Grant NB07867-01, by which the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, reduces the grant to \$2,710 and terminates the grant as of February 29, 1968. The research on the photobiology of marine animals continues under the direction of Dr. Joseph A. Nicol, Professor of Zoology, The University of Texas Marine Science Institute at Port Aransas.
48. Amendment No. 2 to Grant VRA 515-T-68, by which the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Vocational Rehabilitation Administration, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$5,994 to the grant funds. The training in rehabilitation counseling continues under the direction of Dr. Giles D. Carnes, Assistant Professor of Special Education.

PROJECTS SUPPORTED BY NON-FEDERAL SPONSORS:

1. Project No. 104, by which the American Iron and Steel Institute, New York, New York, provides the sum of \$19,980 for support of research entitled "Fatigue Strength of Hybrid Plate Girders Subjected to Combined Bending and Shear." The award is effective for the period January 1, 1968, through March 31, 1968, and the study will be under the direction of Dr. W. Wesley Eckenfelder, Jr., Professor of Civil Engineering.
4. Amendment No. 9 to Contract 58-1692, by which the Sandia Corporation, Albuquerque, New Mexico, extends the period of the contract through December 31, 1967. The research study of explosive shock generators and material shock behavior continues under the direction of Dr. E. A. Ripperger, Professor of Engineering Mechanics.
5. Amendment No. 18 to Subcontract 181471 by which The Johns Hopkins University, Applied Physics Laboratory, Silver Spring, Maryland, extends Task I through January 31, 1968. This modification adds \$10,000 to Task I, increasing the total cost of Task I to \$129,230 and the total cost of the subcontract to \$767,835.15. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
6. Amendment No. 19 to Subcontract 181471, by which The Johns Hopkins University, Applied Physics Laboratory, Silver Spring, Maryland, extends the completion date for Task E to February 29, 1968. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.

ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts have been executed at The University of Texas at Austin by the official indicated. I recommend approval and ratification of signature.

- ✓ 1. Amendment No. 1 to Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-093 with the Texas Water Development Board, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University (Bureau of Economic Geology) and the Water Development Board agree to extend the termination date of the contract now in force from December 31, 1967 to August 31, 1968. This increases the total contract amount from \$13,678 to \$18,803.
2. Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-182 with Texas Education Agency, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Laboratory of Computer-Assisted Instruction will sponsor and conduct a two-day staff development seminar for approximately two hundred professional staff members of the Texas Education Agency who have leadership responsibilities for instructional planning. The contract is in force December 19 and 20, 1967, and the total amount is not to exceed \$270.00.
3. Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-189, with the Texas Department of Public Safety, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its College of Engineering will conduct a course in "Powder X-ray Diffractometry" for one employee of the Department. The period of the contract is January 22-26, 1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$200.00.

4. Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-196 with the State Department of Public Welfare, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Law School Library will provide the facilities, necessary personnel, and all essential materials to train persons included in the work experience and training program under Public Law 88-452, Economic Opportunity Act of 1964. The contract is in force from December 1, 1967 through August 31, 1968, the end of the legislative appropriation year, when it is subject to renewal and extension. No funds are involved.

5. Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-198 with the Texas State Department of Public Safety, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Division of Extension will conduct training courses for supervisory personnel in "Human Relations" and "Motivation and Resistance to Change." The contract is in force March 15 - May 15, 1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$2,000.

6. Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-201 with the Texas Employment Commission, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University will conduct training in Economics and Report Writing for certain approved and selected employees of the Commission during the periods January 22-27 and February 12-17, 1968. The period of the contract is January 15-March 1, 1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$3,400.

7. Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-202 with the Texas Highway Department, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the Highway Department will fabricate magnetic sheet metal parts for the Department of Astronomy. The contract is in force January 11 - February 29, 1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$181.08.

8. Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-204 with the Texas Industrial Commission, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Bureau of Business Research will assist in an industrial development promotion program. The period of the contract is January 15-August 31, 1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$5,000.

9. Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-205 with Southwest Texas State College, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University will furnish the services of an instructor. The contract is in force February 1 - May 31, 1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$1,876.50.

10. Interagency Contract No. IAC(68-69)-206 with Texas Highway Department, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the Highway Department will furnish materials, equipment, labor, supervision and any other items essential in constructing a parking lot and reconditioning the entrance road at Balcones Research Center. The period of the contract is January 1 - August 31, 1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$5,022.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: I recommend approval of the following legislation passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Council:

1. The Faculty Council on November 30, 1967, approved by the no-protest procedure the recommendations of the College of Arts and Sciences, Department of Romance Languages (D&P 4034). This legislation restates the major requirements, both for French and Spanish, under the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, by omitting by name the courses from which nine hours(out of the twenty-one semester hours required) may be taken, and stating only that the nine must be from among courses

carrying the prerequisite of six hours of upper-division courses in the respective languages. This makes clearer the intent to include two levels of upper-division courses, and also eliminates the necessity of making formal changes in the text when there are changes in prerequisites for specific upper-division courses.

2. The Faculty Council at its meeting of December 18, 1967, approved the revision of Plan I recommended by the College of Arts and Sciences (D&P 4068-77). This is a sizable revision of the curriculum for the Bachelor of Arts degree, the result of the work of a special committee appointed by the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences in 1966. The revision does not set up a rigid set of degree requirements but allows freedom to meet differing but specific needs of students. It encourages the taking of courses outside the College of Arts and Sciences beyond those imposed by specific requirements for the Plan I degree program, and also permits a major in a department outside the College of Arts and Sciences with approval of the deans of the colleges. When the major is within the College of Arts and Sciences, the minimum semester hours required for the major course is reduced from twenty-four to twenty-one and no minor is specified, although two majors are possible and will often be recommended for those who may wish to teach two subjects. The legislation also recommends that the students be urged to gain advanced credit by examination, and permits some credit on the pass-fail basis rather than by letter grades. (This last legislation was on the agenda for the January meeting of the Board of Regents.) The revision does not increase the total semester hours beyond 120 required for the Bachelor of Arts degree.

3. The Faculty Council on January 10, 1968, approved by the circularization procedure changes in the College of Education catalogue (D&P 4090). This legislation lists three additional single-subject field specializations for degree and certificate purposes as follows: Earth Science, Economics, and Italian. These are in the secondary education area and require that twenty-four semester hours be earned. The legislation further, under elementary education area, adds Psychology, and in the same area changes the courses in Speech and raises the semester hours required from eighteen to twenty-one, thus strengthening this subject concentration. The Psychology concentration requires twenty-one hours.

4. The Faculty Council on February 5, 1968, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal of the Law School to change its catalogue concerning the honor pledge (D&P 4109). This legislation would not require a student to sign a pledge, the act of turning in his examination being the equivalent of so doing. If he does not turn in his examination, he should advise his Dean immediately of the reasons. The School of Law feels that checking the pledge imposes a burden on the administrative staff during examination periods, and none of the violations that have occurred in the school have been discovered by checking the pledge; i. e. violators have signed the pledge.

COLLEGE WORK-STUDY PROGRAM: The Department of Health, Education and Welfare has approved expenditure of Federal funds for the operation of the College Work-Study Program for the period January 1 - June 30, 1968, in the amount of \$53,325. This brings a total to the University for the twelve month period July 1, 1967 - June 30, 1968, to \$87,513, the amount requested by the University.

Fernea, Director of Middle East Center February 3-5, 1968, to New York City to represent UT Austin at first meeting of charter members of the American Institute of Iranian Studies, returning via Houston to meet with Arab American Society to discuss their Center for Arab Studies and possible contributions from the Society and oil interests of the Middle East to UT Austin's Middle Eastern program of study, expenses in an approximate amount of \$260 to be paid from Excellence Fund allocated to Center for International Studies.
4. Mr. Glenn A. Welsch, Graduate Adviser, Office of Dean, College of Business Administration, to Dallas, Texas, January 16, to meet with Calendar Study Group as Chairman of the Calendar Committee from the General Faculty at Austin, expenses in an approximate amount of \$35.00 to be paid from Miscellaneous Administrative Expenses.
5. Mr. John Frederick Schunk, Assistant Professor of Speech, February 2-3 to Waco, Texas, and February 7-10, 1968, to Evanston, Illinois, to accompany students attending Debate Tournament at Baylor and Northwestern, respectively, expenses in an approximate amount of \$210 for both trips to be paid from funds of the Oratorical Association.
6. Mr. E.
