FEDERAL CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS
BOARD OF REGENTS MEETING - APRIL 9-10, 1981

Office of Naval Research Basic Agreement N00014-79-H-0023

1. Revision #3 to Basic Agreement N00014-79-H-0023 between the Office of Naval Research, United States of America and The University of Texas System. This revises the Basic Agreement, originally effective January 1, 1979, to comply with the current requirements of the Defense Acquisition Regulations and to incorporate the required updated clauses to the Agreement. Individual contracts between the component institutions of The University of Texas System and the Department of Defense may be negotiated under this basic agreement.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH ALLOCATIONS FOR PROGRAM SUPPORT

Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health Trustee Approved Program Support account to the following institutions and agencies:

Southeast Texas Hospice, Orange, Texas - \$7,500.00

1. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends approval of a two-year grant in the amount of \$7,580 for the period of March 1, 1981 to February 28, 1983, to the Southeast Texas Hospice. These funds will be used to initiate a bereavement program.

Approximately 50 families a year will be systematically followed for at least one year after the death of one of their members. The program will strive to create an atmosphere of preventive mental health through open discussion of the responses and reactions that are a normal part of grieving, assessing coping mechanisms, stress levels and support systems, and developing such systems for those individuals who lack them through practical self-help sessions for financial, medical and social adjustments. A unique feature of the program will be the training of approximately 12 volunteers by a professional psychologist. Then, as volunteers receive training and experience, continuity will be achieved by the original volunteers training others with the professional serving only in a consultant role.

Ms. Mary McKenna, Administrator for the Southeast Texas Hospice, will be responsible for administering the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period in March 1983.

Dr. Charles M. Bonjean and Ms. Bert Kruger Smith will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation for this project.

Driscoll Foundation Children's Hospital, Corpus Christi, Texas - \$10,818.00

2. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends approval of a second-year grant in the amount of \$10,818.00 to the Driscoll Foundation Children's Hospital for support of the Social Work Service in the Neonatal Unit. The emotional and social needs of parents of newborn infants, particularly those who need special physical care or have high-risk factors in their birth, have represented both a challenge and an opportunity for special mental health services of great significance. A professionally trained social worker has been a critical new addition to the staff serving infants and young children. The Driscoll Foundation Children's Hospital provides treatment to all children within South Texas, including those from families with severely limited financial resources. The special problems of parental acceptance, parent-infant bonding and the handling of anxiety and grief will be addressed.

The second-year program will include an evaluation procedure to ascertain how well these goals are achieved in the next several years. Assuming that the program continues to move forward an anticipated and that an adequate evaluation of the program is undertaken, an additional grant of approximately \$5,679.00 in the third year is anticipated.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH (Continued)

Mrs. Maud W. Keeling, Director of the Department of Social Work in the Driscoll Foundation Children's Hospital, will be responsible for the administration of the project beginning January 1, 1981, and will submit a progress report prior to December 1, 1981, as a basis for consideration of further funding by the Foundation.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman and Mr. Reymundo Rodriguez will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation for this project.

1981-82 SYSTEM-WIDE PERSONNEL PAY PLAN RECOMMENDATION

Administration of each of the component institutions has made recommendations for adjustments to those classifications utilized at their respective institutions. Chancellor Walker, Vice Chancellor Boyd, and Mr. J. C. Kennedy, System Personnel Director, concur in these recommendations which are reflected in the system-wide 1981-82 Personnel Pay Plan Recommendation effective September 1, 1981.

The Personnel Pay Plan is supported by extensive studies which have been conducted at the respective institutional personnel offices. In arriving at the salary ranges, we have taken into account the State Classification Plan and the projected State Salary Schedule for September 1, 1981, numerous surveys which we have conducted or in which we have participated, pay schedules for other institutions, and prevailing rates in the applicable areas of competition.

Adjustments generally provided for an increase of 14.3% or 10.5% with exceptions for limited classifications. These recommended changes are considered necessary for the University to maintain a competitive position, fairly compensate our employees providing equality with State pay rates, and attract qualified applicants in the current market. Each classification has been considered on its own merits and recommendations for adjustments have been made according to the individual requirements of each classification, as appropriate.

The pay plan, to be effective September 1, 1981, is submitted on the basis that the "emergency" salary increase provided by the Legislature effective February 1, 1981, coupled with a recommended additional increase to be effective September 1, 1981, will result in on-step salary schedule values. In the event off-step values result, we will issue a conversion table to accomplish necessary adjustments.

II. General Regulations

2. The provisions of these regulations must be complied with on all parts of the campus throughout all hours of the day and night with the following exceptions: Any vehicle with a current University decal may park in any University lot except those areas that are "No Parking", "Handicap Parking", "Police Parking", "University Vehicle Parking", "Rent Property", "Visitor Parking", "Dorm Parking", "Fire Lane", or "Health Center Parking" during the following periods: 5 PM Monday - 7 AM Tuesday; 5 PM Tuesday - 7 AM Wednesday; 5 PM Wednesday - 7 AM Thursday; 5 PM Thursday - 7 AM Friday; 5 PM Friday - 7 AM Monday.

6. THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT ARLINGTON RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REMOVE AND IMPOUND ALL VEHICLES PARKED [~~IN-VIOLATION-OF-THESE-REGULATIONS~~] so as to obstruct ingress or egress to buildings or to obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic and to impound vehicles registered to individuals with unpaid traffic fees after notice as outlined in Section IX, 7. The owners of such vehicles shall be responsible for payment of all cost incurred in the removal and storage of such vehicles and neither the University nor its authorized personnel shall be liable for any loss or damage resulting from such removal or storage. The term "impounding" includes the removal and [~~immobilization~~] storage of the vehicle in question. When an impounding violation occurs and the owner or driver of the vehicle appears on the scene before the [~~arrival~~] removal by the wrecker, and the wrecker driver has either made a hookup, or has signed the police report for custody of the vehicle, the following will apply:
 - a. the vehicle will not be impounded;
 - b. and the owner or driver will be expected to pay the wrecker a fee in lieu of towing.

The owners of impounded vehicles must come to the University Police Department to obtain a vehicle release form. Owners must present sufficient identification as being the owner of said vehicle before the release form will be issued.

IX. Enforcement

2. An enforcement and administration fee of ~~\$3.00~~ \$5.00 will be assessed for each University citation for violators with decals. The student, staff, or faculty member who receives a citation must pay the ~~\$3.00~~ \$5.00 enforcement fee at the Bursar's Office within five (5) school days from the date of the citation.

An enforcement and administration fee of \$15.00 will be assessed for each University citation for violators improperly displaying the parking decal as outlined in Part VII PARKING DECALS or for displaying a forged or altered decal. The student, staff, or faculty member who receives a citation must pay the \$15.00 enforcement fee at the Bursar's Office within five (5) school days from the date of the citation.

An enforcement and administration fee of \$24.00 will be assessed for each University citation issued to any vehicle not displaying a current University parking decal. The student, faculty or staff member will be given the opportunity to register their vehicle in lieu of the FIRST no decal citation enforcement fee if the citation is brought to the University Parking Office within five (5) school days from the date of the citation.

IF A STUDENT OR FACULTY/STAFF MEMBER RECEIVES A CITATION FOR NOT DISPLAYING A CURRENT UNIVERSITY PARKING DECAL ON A SECOND CAR THAT IS FAMILY-OWNED, WHEN HE HAD PREVIOUSLY REGISTERED A FIRST VEHICLE, THE ENFORCEMENT FEE OF \$24.00 WILL BE REDUCED TO ~~\$3.00~~ \$5.00 UPON THE SHOWING OF PROOF THAT THE SECOND VEHICLE WAS A FAMILY-OWNED VEHICLE. IN ADDITION TO PAYING THE ~~\$3.00~~ \$5.00 ENFORCEMENT FEE, IT WILL BE PERMISSABLE TO REGISTER THE FIRST AND SECOND VEHICLES ON A POOL DECAL AS OUTLINED IN PART IV, SECTION 5.

EXAMPLES:

- A. A student, faculty, or staff member with a valid decal parks illegally on campus and receives a citation (except for improper display, forged, or altered decal), an enforcement fee of ~~\$3.00~~ \$5.00 is assessed.
 - B. A student, faculty, or staff member receives a citation for improper display or a forged or altered decal, an enforcement fee of \$15.00 is assessed.
3. The enforcement fees assessed for violation of these regulations constitute an indebtedness to the University of Texas at Arlington. In the event that a person fails to pay such fees within the time prescribed herein, The University of Texas at Arlington will take any or all of the following actions:
- A. Suspend the privilege of driving or parking on campus;
 - ~~B. Withhold any remuneration, refund or monetary payment to which the person may be entitled;~~
 - ~~C. Deny readmission to the University of Texas at Arlington;~~
 - ~~D. Withhold the individual's grades and/or official transcript;~~
 - ~~E. Withhold any degree to which the person may be entitled.~~



FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty. I recommend approval.

The General Faculty on October 16, 1980, by the circularization no-protest procedure, approved the Educational Policy Committee Recommendation Concerning Transfer of Credits with a Grade of D (D&M 13824-13825).

EDUCATIONAL POLICY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION CONCERNING
TRANSFER OF CREDITS WITH A GRADE OF D

Amend paragraph 3 under Regulations on pages 40-41 of the 1980-81 General Information bulletin to read as follows:

3. All courses, whether passed, failed, or repeated, are used to compute the applicant's grade-point average for admissions purposes. Courses in which grades of D are earned at other institutions are not transferrable or usable toward degree requirements at The University of Texas at Austin.

In submitting their recommendation to the University Council, the Educational Policy Committee stated:

This legislation has been proposed in response to a charge by President Flawn to "review the basic intent of the rule, make a determination of its applicability to our current situation, and recommend whether we should continue, modify, or eliminate it." The committee members chose to eliminate the transfer of D credits from other institutions primarily for two reasons:

- (1) Many, if not most, of the universities in Texas do not transfer D credits.
- (2) Many degree programs offered at The University of Texas at Austin will not allow credits earned with a D grade to serve as prerequisites for higher courses, and the D credits must be repeated anyway.

The proposed change should tend to insure the integrity of The University of Texas at Austin degree by eliminating the transfer of low-quality work from other institutions.

DALLAS MEDICAL SCHOOL

1. Donald W. Seldin, M.D., Professor and Chairman, Department of Internal Medicine, to travel to London, Paris, Greece and Italy from May 27, 1981 through June 30, 1981. Dr. Seldin will visit colleagues in London and Italy prior to attending the VIII International Congress of Nephrology in Athens, Greece where he will present a paper and chair a Symposium. Following the Congress, he will present studies at satellite meetings in Paris; expenses will be paid from Various Donors Travel funds and from Internal Medicine MSRDP funds.

2. Jere H. Mitchell, M.D., Professor of Internal Medicine, will travel to Copenhagen, Denmark on June 1, 1981 to begin a reassignment of duties effective through August 31, 1981, including 21 vacation days. His reassignment will be to the August Krogh Institute at the University of Copenhagen, Denmark; his salary support during this period will be paid entirely from private grant funds.

3. Frederick Grinnell, Associate Professor of Cell Biology, will travel to Chapel Hill, North Carolina, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and New Haven, Connecticut on December 22, 1980 through January 31, 1981, including 18 days of vacation. He will collaborate in research at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, at the Wistar Institute in Philadelphia, and at Yale University in New Haven; expenses will be paid from a grant entitled, "Research on Cell Substratum Adhesion", Becton-Dickinson.

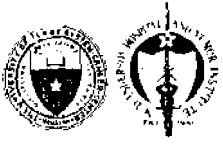


