REPORT OF AMENDMENTS TO THE 1966-67 CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION BUDGET

1. Transfer Charles H. Sparenberg from the Office of the Comptroller to the Office of the Chancellor and change his title from Comptroller to Consultant to the Vice-Chancellor for Business Affairs effective June 1, 1967 with no change in annual salary rate of \$20,500. Salary funds for this change of status are to be transferred from the Comptroller's Office to the Chancellor's Office. (RBC's #62, 63, 64)

2. Transfer Robert L. Anderson from the Office of the Chancellor to the Office of the Comptroller and change his title from Assistant to the Vice-Chancellor for Business Affairs to Comptroller and increase his annual salary rate from \$15,000 to \$18,500 effective June 1, 1967. 1. Transfer of Funds Between Accounts for Addition to Library Building at The University of Texas at Arlington

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

1. Modification No. 3, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 19(628)-1679, by which the Department of the Air Force, Electronic Systems Division, Air Force Systems Command, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, establishes a final overhead rate of 38.7% of salaries and wages for the period January 1, 1963 through August 31, 1964. The research was conducted in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
2. Modification No. 5, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 19(628)-4046, by which the Department of the Air Force, Headquarters Electronic Systems Division, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, adds the sum of \$5,000.00 to the contract funds, making a new total of \$153,850.00; extends the period of the contract through October 31, 1967, with the final report due January 31, 1968; and incorporates in the contract the provisions of the new Air Force Basic Agreement F44621-67-A-0057 between the University and the Air Force. The electromagnetic investigations in the .001 cps to 5 cps region continue in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. H. W. Smith, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
3. Modification No. 1, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 19(628)-5908, by which the Department of the Air Force, Electronics Systems Division, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, adds the sum of \$30,000.00 to the contract funds, making a new total of \$60,000.00. The contract extends the period through March 31, 1968, with the final report due June 30, 1968. The research of an investigation of millimeter wavelength remote sensing of atmospheric temperatures continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of C. W. Tolbert.

4. Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF33(615)-2123, by which the Department of the Air Force, Headquarters, Systems Engineering Group, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, extends the due date of the draft copy of the final technical documentary report to May 15, 1967, with the final report due June 15, 1967. The research continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of C. W. Tolbert.
5. Modification No. 14, Change Order to Contract AF33(616)-3985, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Systems Engineering Group, Research and Technology Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, incorporates in the contract DD Form 254 dated September 30, 1966, in lieu of the DD Form 254 presently incorporated therein. The research was conducted in the Military Physics Research Laboratory under the direction of A. E. Lockenvitz, Professor of Physics.
6. Modification No. 6, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF33(657)-7333, by which the Department of the Air Force, Systems Engineering Group, Research and Technology Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, adds the sum of \$1,441.19 to the contract which represents the final adjustment of costs required under the contract. The research was conducted in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
7. Modification No. 1, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF40(600)-1167, by which the Department of the Air Force, Arnold Engineering Development Center, Arnold Air Force Station, Tennessee, extends the period of the contract through July 31, 1967, with the final report due November 1, 1967. The research on the analytical study of condensation of steam in subsonic streams of rocket exhaust gas continues under the direction of Dr. J. Parker Lamb, Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering.
8. Modification No. A, Grant Amendment to Grant AF-AFOSR-806-65, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, extends the period of the grant through July 31, 1968. The research on "Crystal Chemistry of the Systems Rare Earth -- Groups V and VI Elements" continues under the direction of Dr. Hugo Steinfink, Professor of Chemical Engineering.
9. Contract F30602-67-C-0217 from the Department of the Air Force, Rome Air Development Center, Griffiss Air Force Base, New York, which is effective for the period April 4, 1967 through April 3, 1969, with the final report due May 3, 1969. The contract is in the sum of \$198,092.00; however, only \$40,000.00 is now being made available for the period April 4, 1967, through August 3, 1967. The research in German-English mechanical translation on syntactic level will be performed under the direction of Dr. W. P. Lehmann, Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and of Linguistics, and Director, Linguistics Research Center.
10. Modification No. 5, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF33(657)-8716, establishes a final overhead rate of 38.7% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1964 through February 1, 1965. The study of the effect of absorption of gases and the effective temperature of clouds and atmospheric background in the frequency range from 100 KMC to 160 KMC was conducted under the direction of Dr. A. W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
11. Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF33(657)-11073, establishes a final overhead rate of 38.7% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1964 through May 15, 1965. The research on plasma diagnostic methods for high temperature plasma research was conducted under the direction of Dr. A. A. Dougal, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
12. Modification No. 3, Supplemental Agreement to Contract DA19-129-AMC-582(N), by which the Department of the Army, U. S. Army Natick Laboratories, Natick, Massachusetts, extends the period of the contract to July 31, 1967. The research on ground impact shock mitigation continues under the direction of Dr. E. A. Ripperger, Professor of Engineering Mechanics.

13. Contract DA-AH01-67-C1595, by which the Department of the Army, U. S. Army Missile Command, Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, provides \$11,716.00 for the support of "Analytical Studies of Stress Waves of Viscoelastic Media." The contract is effective for the period April 6, 1967 through January 5, 1968, with the final report due February 5, 1968, and the studies will be performed in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Director.
14. Contract N00014-67-A-0126-0003, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., provides \$26,655.00 for support of helicopter rotor research. The contract is effective for the period February 1, 1967 through January 31, 1968, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. Shao Wen Yuan, Professor of Aerospace Engineering.
15. Contract N00014-67-A-0126-0002, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$14,085.00 for support of research entitled "Scale Model Studies of Low-Frequency Sonar Arrays." The contract is effective for the period December 1, 1966 through November 30, 1967, and the research will be performed in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
16. Modification No. 8, Supplemental Agreement to Contract Nonr-3579(03), by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., extends the period of the contract through June 30, 1967 without additional funds. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
17. Letter of Assignment dated March 9, 1967, under Contract AID/scd-428, by which the Agency for International Development, Washington, D. C. provides the sum of \$150.00 for three days of training in chemistry for five participants from Guatemala. The program will be under the direction of Dr. Joe W. Neal, Director, International Office.
18. Modification No. 1, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(40-1)-3516, by which the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, extends the period of the contract through June 30, 1967, and transfers title to the University of three items of Government-owned equipment used in performance of the contract. The investigations of anomalous diffusion in a linear E-type RF arrangement continues under the direction of Dr. Edward J. Powers, Assistant Professor of Electrical Engineering and of Physics.
19. Grant E22-95-67(G), by which the U. S. Department of Commerce, Environmental Science Services Administration, Boulder, Colorado, provides \$3,567.00 for support of research on the energetics of severe storms with the ultimate goal of determining the energy budget of a severe local storm. The grant is effective for the period February 1, 1967 through January 31, 1968, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. Amos Eddy, Assistant Professor of Meteorology.
20. Graduate Education Grant in Aquatic Sciences No. 14-17-007-668(G), by which the U. S. Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Commercial Fisheries, Washington, D. C., provides support of a graduate educational grant in the field of marine biology and ecology. The grant is effective for a two-year period beginning with the 1967-68 academic year. Dr. B. J. Copeland, Assistant Professor of Zoology, will sponsor the student.
21. Grant No. SCC-40804, by which the U. S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, Washington, D. C., provides \$91,960.00 equivalent in Iraqi dinars and \$131,040.00 U. S. dollars for an educational and cultural exchange program with the University of Baghdad. The grant is effective for the period February 15, 1967 through September 30, 1968, and the program will be under the direction of Dr. Joe W. Neal, Director, International Office.

22. Supplement No. 4 to Grant NsG-432, by which the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$106,800.00 to the grant funds and extends the period of the grant through March 31, 1970. The investigation of millimeter wavelength radiation from solar system bodies continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of C. W. Tolbert.
23. Supplement No. 1 to Grant NGR-44-012-055, by which the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$108,173.00 to the grant funds and extends the period of the grant through April 30, 1968. The study on "Polarization and Time Structure of Jovian Decametric Radiation and the Structure of Interplanetary Plasma" continues under the direction of Dr. James N. Douglas, Associate Professor of Astronomy.
24. Contract NAS5-10387, by which the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Goddard Space Flight Center, Greenbelt, Maryland, provides \$58,000.00 for support of boresight and alignment tests of radio telescope installation. The contract is effective for the period June 1, 1967 through May 31, 1968, and the research will be performed in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of C. W. Tolbert.
25. Grant H67-0-78, by which the National Endowment for the Humanities, National Foundation on the Arts and the Humanities, Washington, D. C., provides \$12,000.00 for support of a project entitled "Expansion of the Archive of Folklore and the Training of Folklorists." The grant is effective for the period September 1, 1967 through August 31, 1968, and the project will be directed by Dr. Mody C. Boatright, Professor of English.
26. Grant No. 1, Project No. 8-1504, by which the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$4,799.00 for support of an educational media workshop to be conducted during the period July 24, 1967 through July 29, 1967. The grant is effective for the period July 1, 1967 through June 30, 1968, and the program will be under the direction of Dr. John W. Meaney, Professor of Radio-Television-Film.
27. Contract No. OEC-4-7-440335-2562, by which the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D. C., provides \$33,690.00 for support of an NDEA Institute for Advance Study in History. The contract is effective for the period November 1, 1966 through October 31, 1967, and the program will be directed by Dr. Warren K. Dean, Assistant Professor of History.
28. Contract No. OEC-4-7-461339-2351, by which the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D. C., provides \$37,901.00 for support of an NDEA Institute for Advanced Study in the Field of English. The contract is effective for the period November 1, 1966 through October 31, 1967, and the study will be carried out under the direction of Dr. Joseph E. Slate, Associate Professor of English.
29. Revision No. 1 to Grant No. OEG 4-6-062022-1375, by which the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D. C., provides an additional \$123,400.00 to the grant funds making a new total of \$243,400.00, and extends the period of the grant through August 31, 1968. The multidisciplinary graduate program for preparation of educational research specialists continues under the direction of Dr. Jackson B. Reid, Professor of Educational Psychology.
30. Revision No. 1, Grant OEG-4-6-062267-1551, by which the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$64,796.00 to the grant funds and extends the period of the grant through August 31, 1967. The special education instructional materials center continues under the direction of Dr. William G. Wolfe, Professor of Special Education.

31. Amendment No. 1 to Contract PC-72-772, by which the Peace Corps, Washington, D. C., modifies the methods of selecting trainees. The contract continues under the direction of Dr. Joe W. Neal, Director, International Office.
32. Revised Grant AM-09143-03, by which the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Public Health Service, authorizes funds to be carried forward from Grant AM-09143-02. The research on "Factors Limiting in vitro Protein Synthesis" continues under the direction of Dr. Boyd A. Hardesty, Assistant Professor of Chemistry.
33. Grant 5T1RH12-07(67), by which the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Public Health Service, provides \$45,014.00 for support of graduate training in radiological health. The grant is effective for the period September 1, 1967 through August 31, 1968, and the program will be directed by Dr. Earnest F. Gloyna, Professor of Civil Engineering.

The research on "Genetic Damage Induced by Chemicals and Radiations" continues under the direction of Dr. Mary L. Alexander, Research Scientist, Genetics Foundation.
35. Revised Grant PHT 4-2C-66, by which the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Public Health Service, authorizes funds to be carried forward from Grant PHT 4-2B-65. The program in graduate training in environmental health engineering - air resources and community health continues under the direction of Dr. Earnest F. Gloyna, Professor of Civil Engineering.
36. Grant No. 67-33, by which the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Welfare Administration, Children's Bureau, Washington, D. C., provides \$103,384.00 for support of a child welfare training program for teaching grants and traineeships. The grant is effective for the period July 1, 1967 through June 30, 1968, and the program will be directed by Dr. Jack Otis, Professor and Director, Graduate School of Social Work.
37. Grant GA-911, by which the National Science Foundation, Washington, D. The program entitled "Physics Education Assistance Project, NSF/AID/CSUCA" continues under the direction of Dr. Robert N. Little, Jr., Professor of Physics.

41. Amendment No. 1 to Grant GP-4936X, by which the National Science Foundation, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$30,600.00 to the grant funds and extends the period of the grant to September 1, 1968. The research on organic chemistry of metal-organic complexes continues under the direction of Dr. Rowland Pettit, Professor of Chemistry.

Colvin, which provides for Basic Officer Weather training for the July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968, for not more than 20 students who are military personnel of the United States Air Force. The estimated total amount of the contract is \$18,180.
2. Interagency Cooperation Contract No. IAC (66-67)-351 with the Texas Education Agency, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Bureau of Business Research will furnish the necessary services, materials, equipment and trained personnel to carry out a computerized study in regard to disabling conditions affecting individuals' abilities to carry on their major activities, and will supply a report of its findings. The period of the contract is April 19 through May 31, 1967, and the total amount to be paid to the University is \$300.

3. Interagency Cooperation Contract No. IAC (66-67)-352, with Texas Employment Commission, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Division of Extension will conduct a seminar for the training and development of certain approved and selected employees of the Commission, furnishing all instruction and instructional aids and materials used in connection therewith. The contract is in force for the period May 7-May 12, 1967, and the total amount paid to the University is not to exceed \$2,500.

4. Interagency Cooperation Contract No. IAC (66-67)-353, with Texas A&M University, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Department of Classics is to make English translations of twenty-two lengthy letters in eighteenth-century Latin, in a form suitable for inclusion in the Texas A&M University's Correspondence of Sir William Jones (1746-94), to be published by the Clarendon press, Oxford. The contract is in force from April 25 through August 31, 1967, and the reimbursement for the service is not to exceed \$200.

5. An agreement with Southwest Texas Area Educational Television Council, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, whereby the University assigns to the Council its right, title and interest in and to the three year lease agreement between Joe Dischinger and the University dated April 30, 1964. The lease concerns a tract of land in Comal County on which a microwave repeater tower is located, and the assignment is executed also by Lola Mae Dischinger, widow of Joe Dischinger, to indicate her consent to the transfer and also to acknowledge receipt of \$166.66 as the rental fee for an additional year.

6. Agreement with Southwest Texas Area Educational Television Council, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, whereby the University assigns to the Council all its right, title and interest in and to the three year lease agreement between the University and the Water Works Board of Trustees of The City of San Antonio, dated May 15, 1964. The lease concerns a tract of land in Bexar County, Texas, on which a microwave repeater tower is located, and the assignment is executed also by the San Antonio Water Works Board of Trustees as evidence of consent to the assignment and as an acknowledgement of receipt of \$100 as the rental for the renewed and extended term of one year.

7. Letter Agreement with Standard Oil Company of Texas, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, whereby the University is permitted to use platforms of Standard in Galveston and Chambers Counties, Texas, for the purpose of conducting a scientific meteorological experiment.

8. Supplemental Agreement to Cooperative Highway Research Agreement, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, which increases the study cost of "Evaluation of Traffic Control at Highway Intersections" from \$25,500 to \$32,000, and the study cost of "Reproduction of Final Reports" from \$3,000 to \$6,745, bringing the program total to \$504,645.

9. Agreement with Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, whereby there is made available to the University at no cost (to assist in its Millimeter Wave Sciences research being carried out at McDonald Observatory) a site on the 5,509 foot peak at Davis Mountain State Park on which a building will be constructed. This agreement will in no way modify or alter the existing lease agreement, dated January 18, 1934, by and between the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and the Merrill Estate, Judge Tom Gray, Administrator.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: I recommend approval of the following legislation passed by the Faculty Council and/or General Faculty:

1. At its meeting on April 17, 1967, the Faculty Council approved the motion that starting with the 1967-68 calendar, the dates of the spring vacation will run from Monday preceding Good Friday through the following Saturday.

2. At its meeting on April 17, 1967, the Faculty Council approved the proposal to establish an administrative committee of the Faculty Council (D&P 3887) consisting of the Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the Secretary of the Faculty Council, and three faculty members to be chosen by the Vice-Chancellor from a panel of five nominated by the Committee on Committees from elected Council members.

3. The General Faculty at its meeting of May 9, 1967, approved the proposal to include Faculty Associates in General Faculty meetings without vote (GFM 9041). Faculty Associate is a new academic position established under the National Science Foundation University Science Development Program.

4. Mr. Addison E. Lee, Director, Science Education Center, to act as a consultant to the Greater Cleveland Science Program of the Educational Research Council.

5. Mr. Keith Morrison, Professor of Law, to prepare a legal memorandum for a Dallas attorney.

6. Mr. Allen E. Smith, Associate Professor of Law, to act as legal representative for a medical doctor in a current dispute with the Texas Medical Association over membership.





BUSINESS CONTRACT ITEMS

I recommend that The University of Texas at El Paso be authorized to execute the following proposed contracts:

1. Contract with Associated Food Services, Inc., P. O. Box 18235, Dallas, Texas, to operate the Main Dining Hall for the fiscal year beginning September 1, 1967. The proposed contract provides that The University of Texas at El Paso will pay the contractor \$1.50 per day per dormitory student. This is the same rate as in the contract with Associated Food Services, Inc. for the 1966-67 fiscal year and would apply to dormitory students for the fall and spring semesters and to each summer term. A mutually negotiated rate will be established for special resident groups, if any, during the summer. Under the proposed contract, the University will receive 15% of regular cash sales for meals; 15% of cash or charge sales from banquets, special groups, etc.; and 10% of sales income from coupon books and special meal tickets sold to students, faculty, and staff. A new provision is in the proposed contract that was not in the old contract and provides for the re-negotiation of the contract if the Federal Minimum Wage Law becomes applicable or if the State passes a minimum wage law that would apply.
2. Contract with Associated Food Services, Inc., P. O. Box 18235, Dallas, Texas, to operate Miners Hall Dining Room (athletic dining room) from August 15, 1967 through August 14, 1968. The proposed contract provides that The University of Texas at El Paso will pay the contractor \$2.50 per day per person living in the dormitories and eating in Miners Hall Dining Room. This is the same rate as in the contract with Associated Food Services, Inc. for the present year. A new provision is in the proposed contract that was not in the old contract and provides for the re-negotiation of the contract if the Federal Minimum Wage Law becomes applicable or if the State passes a minimum wage law that would apply.






