



Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health and Ima Hogg Foundation to the following institutions and agencies:

1. Cancer Counseling, Inc.

Clinical Outpatient Program for Children - \$12,500

The Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a second grant for the period April 1, 1985 to March 31, 1986. The Ima Hogg grant will continue to be used to provide counseling services on an outpatient basis to children with cancer or children of cancer patients. The funds will be used to contract with mental health professionals who are providing the counseling services at a significantly reduced rate. With Ima Hogg support, many Houston children victimized by cancer will receive this much-needed service. Ms. Elise Needell, President of Cancer Counseling, Inc., will be responsible for the administration of the project.

2. Family Outreach of El Paso, Inc.

We Help Ourselves (WHO) - El Paso - \$2,924

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-time grant to provide partial funding for the replication of the "We Help Ourselves" Project for the period June 1, 1985 through May 31, 1986. The "We Help Ourselves" Project is an exemplary, cost-effective program aimed at reducing child victimization by offering direct educational services to children, parents, and people who work with children. The program has been used successfully in both Dallas and Houston. The goal of the program is to teach children how to avoid physical, sexual and emotional abuse by "helping themselves." Ms. Charlene Cardwell, the executive director of the Family Outreach of El Paso, will be responsible for the administration of the project.

3. Gerontology Studies Program, Trinity University, San Antonio, Texas

The Hispanic Victim of Alzheimer's Disease: Service Utilization and Institutional Trajectory - \$18,603

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a one-time grant for the period July 1, 1985 through June 30, 1986. These funds are for partial support of a pilot study on the mental health of families who care for those who are afflicted with Alzheimer's Disease in Hispanic and Anglo populations in San Antonio. Dr. Charles B. White, principal investigator, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

4. Mental Health Association of Houston and Harris County, Inc.

Comprehensive Mental Health Plan for Persons in Crisis - \$21,366

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a grant for the period July 1, 1985 to June 30, 1986. This grant will be used to develop a comprehensive mental health crisis plan for the greater Houston community. The crisis plan will be developed by a task force comprised of individuals representing community groups which would have a role to play in responding to future crises. Ms. Betty Schwartz, the executive director of the Mental Health Association, will be responsible for the administration of the project.

5. National Migrant Referral Project, Inc., Austin, Texas

Developing Resources for Migrant Farmworker Populations - \$6,107

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a one-time grant for the period June 1, 1985 through August 31, 1985. This grant is for partial support of a project to develop information resources aimed at policymakers, researchers and service providers who serve the Texas migrant farmworker population. The NMRP will seek to develop a directory of state agencies and to perform a preliminary analysis of the National Chicano Survey (NCS) which was conducted in 1979 with support from the National Institute of Mental Health. Mr. Dan Cardenas, executive director of the NMRP, will be responsible for administration of the program.

6. The Patrician Movement, San Antonio, Texas

Residential Drug Abuse Treatment Program - \$35,618

The Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a grant for the period July 1, 1985 through June 30, 1986. These funds are for partial support of a residential drug abuse treatment program in San Antonio, Texas. A challenge grant in the second year will be considered, contingent upon satisfactory progress during the first year. Founded in 1959, The Patrician Movement is one of the oldest drug abuse treatment centers in Texas. As a pioneer in the fight against substance abuse in the state, this program has assisted over 20,000 adolescents and adults overcome chemical dependency. The purpose of this project is to develop, implement and evaluate the effectiveness of a unique, volunteer-anchored effort at The Patrician Movement Rehabilitation Program. Msgr. Dermot N. Brosnan, executive director of The Patrician Movement, is responsible for administration of the program.

7. Department of Physical and Health Education, U. T. Austin

Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention Program - \$26,700

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a second-year grant for the period June 1, 1985 through June 1, 1986. This grant is for partial support of a controlled field test of an educational intervention to increase adolescent fertility control. A pilot study, funded by the foundation and other agencies in 1983 and 1984, yielded sufficiently encouraging results to justify a statewide field test to this Health Belief Model educational intervention. The proposed second phase of the project will involve the provision of experimental educational services by eight family planning service providers in different areas of the state. Dr. Marvin Eisen, Assistant Professor of Physical and Health Education, is responsible for administering the program.

Diagnosing Hispanic Psychiatric Patients - \$21,928

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a one-time grant for the period May 1, 1985 through August 31, 1985. This grant is for interim funding and partial support of a research project to focus on the validity and reliability of the Diagnostic Interview Schedule (DIS) when used with Hispanic and Anglo psychiatric patients. Dr. Robert E. Roberts, Professor and Director of the Social Psychiatry Research Group is responsible for the administration of this project.

U. T. Health Science Center - San Antonio

Factors Contributing to Differences in Heavy Drinking and Alcohol-Related Problems among Anglo, Mexican-American, and Black Males - \$6,800

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a one-time grant for the period July 1, 1985 through June 30, 1986. This grant is for the partial support of a research project to examine racial/ethnic differences in drinking patterns and problems. The importance of this project lies in its potential to identify minority status, sociodemographic, cultural and/or attitudinal factors which account for racial/ethnic differences in heavy drinking problems in these high-risk groups of drinkers. The results of this study will have preventive and therapeutic policy implications. Drs. Margaret Sue Hoppe and James Alan Neff are responsible for administration of the program.

1985-86 SYSTEM-WIDE PERSONNEL PAY PLAN RECOMMENDATION

The Administration of each of the component institutions has made recommendations for adjustments to those classifications utilized at their respective institutions. The Office of the Chancellor concurs in these recommendations which are to be reflected in the System-wide 1985-86 Personnel Pay Plan effective September 1, 1985. The 1985-86 System-wide Personnel Pay Plan Comparative is submitted for approval at this time.

The Personnel Pay Plan is supported by extensive studies which have been conducted by the respective institutional personnel offices. In arriving at the salary ranges, we have taken into account the State Classification Plan and the State Salary Schedule for September 1, 1985, which reflects a general rate increase of 3%. Also considered were numerous salary surveys which we have conducted or in which we have participated, pay schedules for other institutions, and prevailing rates in the applicable areas of competition.

Generally, component institutions elected to convert their 1984-85 pay plan rates to 1985-86 step values rather than adjust their pay plans by the 3% general increase. However, a limited number of classifications were adjusted upward in an effort to remain competitive, and fairly compensate employees. There were four institutions who chose to adjust their pay plans by the 3% general increase to maintain their competitive position in the market, and attract and retain qualified applicants. Each classification has been considered on its own merits and recommendations for adjustments have been made according to the individual requirements of each classification as appropriate.

Those employees who wish to observe a religious holiday in addition to the ones cited above may do so by taking a vacation day or by observing some other religious holiday in lieu of the holidays cited above.

The Appropriations Bill provides that the administrative head may at his or her discretion give an employee a day of leave on the third Monday in January in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday. This day is in lieu of one of the preceding special leave days.

The Appropriation Bill provides ten and one-half (10-1/2) working days basic vacation allowance for employees of the State to be accrued on a basis of seven (7) hours per month. All regular staff employees will accrue seven (7) hours of vacation leave for each month employed.

The Appropriation Bill also provides that State employees with long-term service shall accrue additional vacation leave in accordance with the following schedule:

Although all employees are encouraged to utilize vacation in the year which accrued, employees may carry forward unused vacation from one fiscal year to the next. The schedule presented above indicates maximum carry forward authorized by the Appropriation Bill.

Each employee will earn vacation entitlement beginning on the first day of employment with the State and terminating on the last day of duty. Credit for one month's accrual will be given for each month or fraction of a month of employment with the State. Vacation with pay may not be granted until the employee has had continuous employment with the State for six (6) months, although credit will be accrued during that period.

The skeleton work force will be on hand.

I. QUICK REFERENCE TO PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

4. SPECIFIC CLASSES OF VEHICLES: Decals issued are for four wheeled vehicles (faculty/staff or student), and motorcycles and bicycles.

VIII. ENFORCEMENT

- B. 4. If a student or faculty/staff member receives a citation for not displaying a current University parking decal on a second car that is family owned, when he had previously registered a first vehicle, the enforcement fee of \$24.00 will be reduced to \$5.00 upon the showing of proof that the second vehicle was a family-owned vehicle. In addition to paying the \$5.00 enforcement fee, it will be permissible to register the first and second vehicles on a car pool decal.

Examples:

- a. A student, faculty or staff member with a valid decal parks illegally on campus and receives a citation (except for improper display, forged, or altered decal), and enforcement fee of \$5.00 is assessed.

- b. A student, faculty or staff member receives a citation for improper display or a forged or altered decal, an enforcement fee of \$15.00 is assessed (provided the student, faculty/staff member does not meet the previously stated requirements for having an improperly displayed violation reduced).
4. An enforcement and assessment fee of \$50.00 will be assessed for each University citation for violators illegally parked in handicap parking.
5. If a student or faculty/staff member receives a citation for not displaying a current University parking decal on a second car that is family-owned, when he had previously registered a first vehicle, the enforcement fee of \$24.00 will be reduced to \$5.00 upon the showing of proof that the second vehicle was a family-owned vehicle. In addition to paying the \$5.00 enforcement fee, it will be permissible to register the first and second vehicles on a car-pool decal.

X. SHUTTLE BUSES

A Shuttle Bus System will operate from Maverick Stadium and the Athletic Field on approximate five minute intervals. Persons riding the shuttle buses will be transported to the designated bus stop at the Library turnaround and at the northwest portion of campus between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Pickup for return trips will be from the designated bus stops near the Library and at the northwest portion of campus and will operate on the same intervals. Two buses will continue to run from 2:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. Mondays through Fridays. Persons utilizing the shuttle buses may park at the Stadium and Athletic Field regardless of decal designation (open parking). The hours of operation for the shuttle buses may be altered to meet the needs of the campus community.

X. SHUTTLE BUSES

A Shuttle Bus System operates on a circular route throughout campus Mondays through Fridays 7:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. on school days. Persons who use the shuttle bus may park at either Maverick Stadium or Arlington Athletic Field pickup sites if the vehicles bear any properly displayed current UTA decal. Special routes are run between Activities Building and Davis Hall during semester registration. Routes and hours of operation are altered to meet University community needs. Consult UTA Police shuttle bus brochures for route updates.







PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

GENERAL INFORMATION

Pursuant to Texas Education Code Sections 51.201 et seq., 54.005, 54.503, 65.31 and 75.001, the Board of Regents of The University of Texas System authorizes the following Parking and Traffic Regulations. The civil and criminal laws of the United States, the State of Texas and these Parking and Traffic Regulations of The Institute of Texan Cultures are hereby declared to be in full force and effective on the grounds of The Institute of Texan Cultures.

The Institute Police Personnel are empowered to enforce all of these laws and regulations.

The Institute will not, nor will its employees, assume any responsibility for the care and protection of any vehicle or its contents at any time that it is operated or parked on the grounds.

Any person who willfully or through negligence causes damage to The Institute of Texan Cultures property shall be liable for any damage done to said property.

ARTICLE I.

SUBDIVISION I TERMS DEFINED

Section 1 - INSTITUTE

The University of Texas Institute of Texan Cultures at San Antonio.

Section 2 - INSTITUTE GROUNDS

The grounds, buildings, structures, parking lots, thoroughfares, etc., under the control of The Institute.

Section 3 - POLICE CHIEF

Police Chief of The University Police Department.

Section 4 - UNIVERSITY POLICE

The University Police Force acting directly or through its duly authorized officers, guards and agents.

Section 5 - DRIVER

Every person who drives, operates or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.

Section 6 - MOTOR VEHICLE

For the purpose of these regulations, includes automobiles, buses, trucks, trailers, motorcycles, motor-scooters, motor-bikes, and tractors.

Section 7 - VISITOR

A person who is not a staff member of The Institute.

Section 8 - STAFF MEMBER

Every person who is an employee.

Section 9 - OTHERS

Persons designated and identified as tenants, volunteer workers, and docents.

Section 10 - DECALS

Parking Permit Decals issued by The Institute to be affixed on motor vehicles.

Section 11 -

The defined terms are in addition to the definitions and terms of the Texas Motor Vehicle Laws which shall apply on the grounds.

SUBDIVISION II
GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1 - The purpose of these regulations is to provide for the safety and welfare of all persons on The Institute Grounds and to provide for the control of traffic and parking.

Section 2 - If any part of these parking and traffic regulations is held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions which can be given effect without the invalid provision, and to this end the provisions of these regulations are declared to be severable.

Section 3 - The provisions of these regulations shall be cumulative of all of State laws to the extent there is no conflict with these regulations.

Section 4 - On special occasions and in emergencies, the University Police Chief may impose temporary parking and traffic control restrictions. These temporary restrictions are legally effective with adequate notice to individuals driving and parking on Institute property. These temporary restrictions shall have all the force of other written and approved regulations and shall be subject to the same penalties.

Section 5 - It shall be a violation to commit any act prohibited by these regulations or to fail to do any act required by these regulations.

Section 6 - The operation of a motor vehicle shall be restricted to the drives, streets and parking lots. Grounds maintenance vehicles are excepted.

Section 7 - Motor vehicles operated or parked on the grounds must comply with all State Laws, City Ordinances and the Parking and Traffic Regulations of The Institute.

Section 8 - The speed limit on roads and streets of The Institute is 05 miles per hour.

Section 9 - The driver of any vehicle involved in a collision shall immediately stop at the scene of such accident or collision, and by the quickest means of communication report such accident or collision to University Police.

Section 10 - No person shall fail or refuse to comply with any lawful order or direction of any University Police Officer.

SUBDIVISION III OPERATION OF VEHICLES ON GROUNDS

Section 1 - All vehicles operated or parked upon the grounds shall properly display a current registration decal or pay the visitor's parking fee or display a visitor's parking permit.

Section 2 - All vehicles operated on the grounds shall be in compliance with these rules and regulations and the Texas Motor Vehicle Laws.

Section 3 - All vehicles are required to stop completely at each STOP sign, and then proceed cautiously without creating a hazard to vehicles not required to stop.

Section 4 - Bicycles shall not be operated on pedestrian walkways or sidewalks, and shall be operated in accordance with Texas law.

Section 5 - The operator of a motor vehicle shall yield right-of-way to pedestrians.

Section 6 - No person shall stand in the roadway for purpose of soliciting a ride.

Section 7 - No operator of a motor vehicle shall drive beyond a barricaded area, or where prohibited by temporary or permanent signs and no operator or person shall remove such barricades or signs. Institute employees whose job is to deliver, install or pick-up such barricades or temporary signs upon request by the Police Department are excepted.

Section 8 - No person in control or possession of a motor vehicle shall bring the same to a sudden start or stop on a parking lot or street, accelerate or race the motor so as to cause a loud noise in a manner calculated to disturb the person or persons present.

ARTICLE II

SUBDIVISION I VEHICLE REGISTRATION, PARKING PERMITS

Section 1 - Only motor vehicles which have a valid parking permit decal issued by The Institute may park on the grounds without paying the visitor parking fee, or displaying a visitor's parking permit.

Section 2 - A parking permit decal will be issued after the motor vehicle has been properly registered and the parking permit fees paid.

- a. Parking fees are paid at The University of Texas Institute of Texan Cultures Business Office.
- b. Visitor parking: Limited to designated areas, or as directed by U.T.I.T.C. Police. No overnight parking permitted. Fees for visitor parking - days \$1.00 until 5PM. Evenings and night parking - \$2.00.
- c. Staff Members may pay their parking fee when they register their vehicle, but no later than 5 days after the first pay period. Motor vehicles must be registered on the first day of work for new Staff Members.
- d. New Staff Members must obtain a temporary parking permit from The Institute Security on their first day of work if unable to pay their parking fee. This temporary permit shall expire on the fifth day after their first pay period. At this time Staff Member must purchase parking permit.
- e. When one of the decals is a reserved decal, then only the vehicle bearing the reserved decal and operated by the individual eligible for the reserved permit shall be parked in the reserved area.

Section 3 - Proof of ownership and valid Texas Driver's License is required at the time of registrations of any vehicles. Staff Members may register only vehicles which are owned by the Staff Member or the spouse. Exceptions are made for company or leased vehicles.

Section 4 - Persons who pay the required fee for one vehicle may obtain multiple parking permit decals for other vehicles which they may own.

- a. A fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each additional vehicle registered if the first vehicle registered was a four-wheel vehicle.
- b. Multiple parking permits ordinarily entitle the holder to park only one vehicle on Institute Grounds at any given time.

Section 5 - Parking permits are effective September 1 to August 31 of each year.

Section 6 - One parking permit decal will be issued for each vehicle registered.

- a. The decal is to be properly affixed to the inside glass on the lower right corner of the front windshield.
- b. Decals are to be affixed so that they can be readily seen and read. The decals are self-adhering and shall not be affixed in any other manner.
- c. Decals are not transferable and must be affixed to the vehicle for which they were issued. Decals shall be removed when the vehicle is sold or otherwise disposed of.
- d. Decals for motorcycles, motor-scooters, motor-bikes, and bicycles, are to be affixed so they will be easily seen.

- e. All out-dated decals will be removed.

Section 7 - If a parking permit decal is desired for a replacement motor vehicle, it will be necessary to destroy the old decal and give written notice that such has been done. After the replacement vehicle has been properly registered, a new parking permit decal will be issued upon payment of a \$1.00 fee.

Section 8 - Any change in registration or ownership of a vehicle shall be reported to the Institute Police Department within ten days.

Section 9 - Falsification of information on the motor vehicle registration form may result in cancellation of parking privileges and employee discipline.

Section 10 - PARKING IN RESTRICTED AREAS:

- a. Parking in loading zones and service drives is restricted to trucks and trailers, and is limited to the time actually loading and unloading.
- b. Parking in a loading zone or service drive by a passenger vehicle may be allowed, only for the actual process of loading and unloading equipment, supplies, and merchandise, and when a temporary parking permit is obtained from University Police and displayed on the windshield. This type of permit is for maximum time of 30 minutes.

Section 11 - Parking during Folklife Festival. All Staff Members are reminded that only a valid ITC Parking Decal will be the admission to reserved parking areas anytime it is necessary to close The Institute grounds for the Festival or otherwise.

Section 12 - Any Staff Member who does not normally drive his or her vehicle to work during the year, but is forced to have transportation during Folklife due to work schedule, may be considered an exception to the rules, in which case such Staff Member may be permitted to pay a \$6.00 fee, for staff parking during that period.

SUBDIVISION II PARKING PERMIT FEES AND REFUNDS

Section 1 - PARKING PERMIT APPLICATION

- a. When application is made for a parking permit, the fee charged shall be for a complete fiscal year.
- b. Any newly hired employee will be an exception when applying for a parking permit, in which case the fee charged will be prorated for the remaining unexpired portion of the ITC fiscal year.
- c. Staff members who normally do not drive to work, please refer to Article II, Subdivision I, Section 12, of the Parking and Traffic Regulations.

Section 2 - PERMIT CLASSES AND FEES

- a. Reserved Parking Area (optional)
 Restricted to the Executive Director,

- b. Institute Staff \$12.00 Year
- c. Motorcycles, motor scooters, motorbikes \$ 6.00 Year
- d. Car Pool - Refer to Subdivision III for an
 explanation.

Section 3 - PARKING FEE REFUND

- a. A person having purchased an ITC parking permit for the fiscal year may receive a refund on the unused or remaining portion of the ITC fiscal year. Any request for a refund will not be honored unless it is filed with the ITC Police Department during the current fiscal year in which payment for the permit was made. A request for a refund must be accompanied by the remnants of the appropriate decal. Refunds will be made upon request and only in the event employment or services are terminated by resignation or leave without pay. The refund will be based on the number of full months remaining in the fiscal permit year. A request for a refund will not be honored when a person's privilege to park or drive on ITC property has been suspended nor if outstanding charges or other debts remain unpaid.

Section 4 - All disabled veterans whose vehicles display the specially designed license plates issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the words "DISABLED VETERAN" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e and all permanently disabled persons whose vehicles display the specially designed symbols, tabs, or other device issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the word "DISABLED" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e.1 are exempt from parking permit fees and from parking meter fees and time limits. These exemptions do not permit parking a vehicle at a place or time that parking is prohibited.

SUBDIVISION III CAR POOL RULES, PERMITS AND FEES

Section 1 - Car pools shall consist of at least two persons.

Section 2 - Each vehicle must be registered and will be issued a car pool parking permit decal. Decal shall be affixed to the glass of the front windshield (lower right-hand corner).

Section 3 - Each car pool will be issued a transferable car pool card. The card must be displayed so it can be readily seen and read through the front windshield on the driver's side.

Section 4 - The car pool decal and the car pool card must both be displayed on the vehicle parked in the car pool parking area. Special areas will be designated for car pool parking.

Section 5 - Only one vehicle in each car pool shall be parked on the grounds.

Section 6 - Whenever an unregistered vehicle is used due to an emergency, the driver shall notify University police by calling 246.

Section 7 - When a person leaves a car pool, the car pool decal must be removed and its remnants turned in to the University Police office.

Section 8 - When there are any changes in vehicles, such as adding or removing any vehicle, a new car pool card must be secured.

Section 9 - Car pool permits are valid for one year (September 1-August 31).

Section 10 -

a. Car pool fees.

b. There will be no charge for additional vehicles or replacement decals.

Section 1 - ENFORCEMENT OF CAR POOL RULES.

a. Failure to abide by the car pool rules shall constitute a violation and an enforcement fee will be assessed.

b. Issuance of two violation citations for parking two vehicles of a car pool on grounds at the same time shall be grounds for the car pool member to be removed from the car pool, and be assessed the full amount of the regular parking fee for the balance of the fiscal year in addition to the enforcement fee.

ARTICLE III

SUBDIVISION I PARKING REGULATIONS

Section 1 - Parking is restricted to lined parking spaces. Motor vehicles shall be parked within the boundaries of these lined spaces, or as directed by the University Police Officer on duty. The fact that other vehicles are parked improperly shall not constitute an excuse for parking with any part of the car over the line.

Section 2 - Bicycles shall not be parked anywhere except in the bicycle parking areas.

Section 3 - Parking is not allowed where prohibited by signs, permanently or temporarily posted, yellow curbs, or other markings on streets and parking lots.

Section 4 - Parking is prohibited on any lawn, curb, sidewalk, or any area not designated as a parking space or lot, or in any restricted or unauthorized area unless directed by the University Police.

Section 5 - IT IS PROHIBITED TO PARK A MOTOR VEHICLE IN ANY PLACE WHERE IT MAY CREATE A TRAFFIC HAZARD OR WHERE IT BLOCKS AN ENTRANCE, EXIT, FIRE LANE OR AISLE. VEHICLES FOUND IN VIOLATION WILL BE TOWED AWAY.

Section 6 - Parking on The Institute Grounds for more than 24 hours without being moved, or at any time for the purpose of storage or repairing such vehicle (except emergency repairs) is prohibited. Vehicles which are the property of The Institute, parked in their proper spaces, are excepted. The Executive Director's vehicle is excepted. Vehicles left at The Institute while owner is using an Institute vehicle on official business are excepted.

Section 7 - Staff members are prohibited from parking in the visitor parking spaces at any time, unless directed to do so by a University Police officer.

Section 8 - When motor vehicles are parked diagonally or perpendicular to a curb the front wheels must be within 12 inches from the face of the curb.

Section 9 - Reserved spaces for handicapped may be used only by persons who have a parking permit for that reserved space.

Section 10 - Parking on The Institute Grounds is prohibited unless the vehicle properly displays a current parking permit or decal issued by the University Police, or unless the posted visitor parking fee is paid.

Section 11 - Vehicles found parked in violation of any State Law, City Ordinance or in violation of these regulations or parked in such a manner as to create a traffic hazard, may be impounded, relocated or immobilized at the expense of the violator. The Institute shall not, nor shall any of its authorized personnel, be liable or assume any responsibility for any loss or damage suffered because of such impoundment, immobilization or relocation.

Section 12 -

- a. Passenger vehicles or trucks shall not be parked in spaces reserved for motorcycles or bicycles.
- b. Motorcycles, motor-scooters, motor-bikes and bicycles shall not be parked in spaces designated for passenger vehicles or trucks.

Section 13 - Motor vehicles shall not be parked so as to obstruct the entrance to or exit of a building.

Section 14 - Vehicles shall not be parked in any area other than that designated by the decal on the vehicle.

Section 15 - On special occasions and during emergency periods, the University Police may prohibit or limit traffic and parking on The Institute Grounds or any portion thereof.

Section 16 - No person shall stop, stand or park any vehicle within an intersection, on a crosswalk, or sidewalk.

SUBDIVISION II
 PARKING AREAS

- PARKING LOT #1 The parking lot adjacent to Durango Street will be used by all staff employees not eligible for reserved, handicapped, or car pool parking. Unoccupied spaces in Lot #1 may be used by visitors, subject to parking fee.
- PARKING LOT #2 Ramp drive, from the east fence to the bottom area, is for reserved parking on both sides of the ramp, with the bottom area spaces reserved for Executive Director, handicapped, official vehicles, and vehicles loading or unloading.
- PARKING LOT #3 Parking lot adjacent to Bowie Street will be used exclusively for visitors, subject to parking fee.
- PARKING LOT #4 Flagpole Area, in front of The Institute, is restricted for use by buses, volunteers, or as directed by the University Police.
- PARKING LOT #5 The Lagoon Parking Lot adjacent to the lagoon and the overhead walkway, is visitor parking, subject to parking fee, and may be used by staff employees and volunteers, or as directed by the University Police. Spaces 76 through 90 in this area are reserved exclusively for UTSA.
- PARKING LOT #6 Goliad Street Parking Lot, is for use by visitors or public, subject to parking fee.

ARTICLE IV

SUBDIVISION I
 ENFORCEMENT

Section 1 - Institute citations may be issued by the University Police.

- a. When an Institute citation is issued, the person in whose name the parking permit decal was issued or vehicle is registered to must pay an administrative enforcement fee within 15 calendar days unless ticket is marked "WARNING." These fees shall be paid at the Business Office.
- b. The enforcement fees assessed for violation of these regulations constitute an indebtedness to The Institute. In the event that a person fails to pay such fees, The Institute will take any or all of the following actions:
 1. Suspend the privilege of driving or parking on the grounds for up to one year;
 2. Disciplinary action and other enforcement actions as authorized;
 3. Impoundment of vehicle.

- c. Institute citations are issued for three classes of violations: parking violations, moving violations, and registration violations. Violations are described in Section 4 below.

d. Appeals:

1. Appeal of an Institute citation may be made within fifteen working days to the Parking and Traffic Committee.
2. Any fee for an Institute citation being appealed, should not be paid before or during the Appeal Process.
3. The action of the Committee shall be final.
4. Any person who has received an Institute citation may appeal by filing a written statement, setting forth grounds on which he/she believes that the citation should be dismissed. The appeal must contain citation number and the violation charged. If the person receiving the citation desires to appear in person before members of the Committee, he/she shall request such personal appearance in the written statement. The written statement must be presented to the chairperson of the Committee within 15 working days from the date the citation was issued.
5. If the Parking and Traffic Committee rules in favor of the appellant, he/she shall be entitled to reimbursement for any fee that he/she has paid as a result of such alleged violation.

Section 2 - CANCELLATION OF PARKING PRIVILEGE:

- a. The Parking and Traffic Committee may prohibit a person from operating or parking a motor vehicle on The Institute Grounds if that person has received four or more citations in a year. Such suspension of the privilege of driving or parking on the grounds may be imposed for a period not to exceed one year.
- b. If a person has been barred from operating or parking a vehicle on the Institute Grounds but continues to do so, this may be grounds for employee discipline, which may include dismissal.

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Section 3 - REINSTATEMENT OF PARKING PRIVILEGE:

- a. At the discretion of the Parking and Traffic Committee, a person whose privilege of parking a motor vehicle on the grounds has been suspended or cancelled may obtain restoration of his/her privilege if he/she pays a reinstatement fee of \$10.00. This will be in addition to any other fees due for traffic violations.

Section 5 - IMPOUNDING OF VEHICLES

- a. Article III, Subdivision I, Section 5, Page 9 of the Parking and Traffic Regulations, refers to conditions under which a vehicle will be towed away. Vehicles creating a traffic hazard, blocking an entrance, exit, fire lane, or aisle will be towed away.

Impoundment: In addition to any charge that may be levied by The Institute for an offense resulting in removal or immobilization, the owner of an impounded vehicle must also pay a commercial wrecker

service fee and storage charges. When an impound violation occurs and the owner or driver of the vehicle appears on the scene before the arrival of the wrecker, the vehicle will not be impounded. If the owner or driver appears on the scene after the arrival of the wrecker and the wrecker driver has made a hookup, the following procedure will apply: 1. the vehicle will not be impounded; 2. the owner or driver will be expected to pay the wrecker a fee for the hookup in lieu of towing. If the vehicle is impounded, the registered owner or permanent holder will be notified at his or her address.

When unpaid traffic charges are recorded, the Parking and Traffic Committee will send a letter to the last known address of the person in whose name the charges are recorded.

Such letter shall state that unless payment of all accumulated charges is made within twelve (12) calendar days after the date of the letter or to a written request as made within twelve (12) calendar days to appear before a Hearing Committee concerning impoundment of the vehicle or other appropriate action, the enforcement action will take place without further notice.

This hearing is not an appeal of parking and traffic citations but is a limited hearing to allow the individual an opportunity to show that the vehicle in question was not owned, registered or used by the individual or to show that the individual receiving notice of impending sanctions does not have unpaid parking and traffic charges.


At such hearing, which shall be held after a reasonable period of time, the person requesting the hearing will assume the burden of showing why the appropriate enforcement action shall not take place.

If timely payment is not received and either the registered owner or the person who has registered the vehicle with The Institute has failed to appear at the requested impoundment hearing, the vehicle may be impounded pending payment of all outstanding charges, including towing and storage, without further notice.

The University Police are here to protect The Institute's property and your personal property, to enforce the Parking and Traffic Regulations, and to be of service to you.

The University Police have a job to perform for The Institute as you have a job to do in your department. Your cooperation will be appreciated.

Should you have a complaint in regard to the way a University Police Officer is doing his/her job or against the officer, you should immediately call the Police supervisor of the University Police Department.



The Catalog Changes recommended for approval by the U.T. Board of Regents have been approved by an attorney in the Office of General Counsel.

The curriculum for Dental Assisting Education includes 12 months of classroom and laboratory instruction and clinical application and experience. Of the ~~45~~ 46 semester hours required for the certificate, nine hours are transferable courses from San Antonio College.

Dental Hygiene Education requires 24 months of study, with the curriculum composed of 20 semester hours of liberal arts course work from San Antonio College and ~~59~~ 60 semester hours of dental sciences from the Health Science Center.

Medical Technology Education is a four-year integrated program which includes general education, basic sciences, and medical technology courses from both UTSA and UTHSCSA. ~~and~~ The final year is devoted to concentrated clinical training in ~~the final year~~ at the Health Science Center and area hospitals. The minimum number of semester hours required for the baccalaureate degree is ~~142~~ 143.

The four-year Occupational Therapy Education program consists of two years of general education course work from UTSA or equivalent preparation and upper-division clinical work, completed at UTSA and UTHSCSA, commencing in the junior year. The minimum number of semester hours required for the baccalaureate degree is ~~137~~ 136.

Physical Therapy Education requires four years of study, including general education course work from UTSA in the first two years with advanced academic and clinical work, beginning in the summer of the junior year, from ~~both UTSA and UTHSCSA~~ the Health Science Center. The minimum number of semester hours required for the baccalaureate degree is ~~150~~ 146.

Conduct and Discipline

Students are responsible for knowing and observing the University's Regulations Governing Student Conduct and Discipline and the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents of The University of Texas System. Copies of the regulations are available from the Office of Student Services. In addition to these regulations, standards of professional conduct may be set by each school of the Health Science Center.

In summary, the Regulations provide that:

Every faculty member, student, and administrative official has the right to initiate disciplinary complaints and the responsibility to do so when scholastic dishonesty is involved.

The Director of Student Services is responsible for investigating allegations of violations of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents and the Regulations Governing Student Conduct and Discipline. A student accused of misconduct is presented with the charges in writing.

If the accused does not dispute the facts and waives a hearing, the Director of Student Services or the person acting in the capacity of Dean of Student Affairs assesses a penalty consistent with those outlined in the regulations. If the student desires a hearing, a hearing officer will be selected by the University President to hear evidence, to adjudicate guilt or innocence, to render a written decision, and to impose a penalty if one is due. The decision may be appealed in turn to the President of the Health Science Center.

Penalties which may be imposed include a warning, probation, a financial penalty when property damage is involved, suspension of rights and privileges deriving in whole or part from the University, suspension of eligibility for office or honor, loss of credit for scholastic work, reduction of the grade in an assigned course, a failing examination grade, a failing grade in the course, suspension from the University, withholding of grades, degree or official transcript, expulsion, or other penalty imposed by the hearing officer.

The full text of the Regents' Rules and Regulations should be consulted for questions concerning student conduct and discipline.

Guide for Professional Conduct

The School of Allied Health Sciences has adopted and published a Guide for Professional Conduct which is available in each program director's office. Students are expected to exhibit the professional behavior described in the Guide as a prerequisite for continuing advancement.

Appeal of Academic and/or Professional Conduct

The Academic Appeal Board of the School of Allied Health Sciences provides students and faculty with an objective appraisal of questions of an academic nature such as an individual grade, evolution of clinic proficiencies, satisfactory completion of projects, et. or questions of professional conduct and behavior. Copies of Procedure for Appeal of Academic and/or Professional Conduct are available in the office of each program director.

The Academic Appeal Board is an advisory body rather than a decision-making body; its findings may be appealed to the Faculty Council of the School of Allied Health Sciences.

Questions of scholastic dishonesty and other infractions of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents of The University of Texas System or the Regulations Concerning Student Conduct and Discipline of the Health Science Center are not considered by the Academic Appeal Board of the School of Allied Health Sciences. Established policies of the Health Science Center, the School of Allied Health Sciences, or the individual programs will not be considered by the Academic Appeal Board.

Students may be considered for advancement on probation under the following conditions: (1) The student withdraws from a prescribed course in the curriculum with the approval of the program director

MEDT 20351. Hematology 3 semester hours

A study of the normal production, maturation, and function of erythrocytes, leukocytes, and platelets. Common disorders involving such cells will be discussed with emphasis on the pathogenic mechanisms. Normal and abnormal hemostasis will be also considered. Hemotologic laboratory tests and their correlation with disease states will also be examined. Normal hemostasis will be considered including pertinent laboratory tests.

MEDT 30361. Immunohematology and Serology 3 semester hours

Prerequisite: MEDT 20351.

A study of the major blood groups of man. Topics will include antigen structure, immune and naturally occurring antibodies, and specific bloodbanking techniques to detect antigen antibody reactions. The major serologic tests used in the laboratory and their correlation with disease states will also be examined. The serology section emphasizes the major serologic tests used in the clinical laboratory and their correlation with disease states. In the immunohematology section, students study the major blood groups of man including the antigens and immune and naturally occurring antibodies. The student is introduced to theories of compatibility testing, hemolytic disease of the newborn, and antibody investigation.

A student whose grade point average falls below 2.8 or who receives a grade lower than C in a basic sciences of medical technology course will be placed on probation. Any student who fails to meet the specified requirements during the probationary semester will be dismissed from the program. Before hospital rotations begin in the senior year, the student must raise his or her GPA to at least 2.8 and remediate D or F grades. Failure to remediate to a grade of C or better after repeating the course one time will result in the student's dismissal from the program. The preprofessional phase, which includes general education requirements and prescribed lower-division work, is offered at The University of Texas at San Antonio. Beginning in the junior year, the professional phase of the program consists of academic and clinical courses from both UTSA and UTHSCSA from the Health Science Center. Graduates of the program become eligible to take the examination for licensure as a physical therapist.

Admission Requirements

Admission into the professional phase (upper-division courses) of the program in Physical Therapy requires that the student successfully complete a minimum of 63-65 semester hours of lower-division course work, including general education requirements and prerequisites for the professional phase from The University of Texas at San Antonio. An overall grade point average of 2.8-3.0 is required for application.

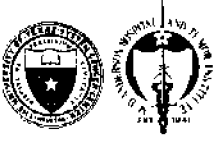


